BEGUN and holden at St. John's in the Province of Newfoundland on Thursday, the eighth day of March, Anno Domini, Nineteen Hundred and Ninety, being the thirty-eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty our Sovereign Lady, Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God in the United Kingdom, Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, QUEEN, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor having fixed the hour at which he proposed to open the present Session of the Legislature at two of the clock in the afternoon of this Thursday, eighth day of March, the Members of the House of Assembly met in the Assembly Chamber at two of the clock in the afternoon when Mr. Speaker took the Chair.

Thursday, March 8th, 1990

At two of the clock the Sergeant-at-Arms announced that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor had arrived.

His Honour entered the Assembly Chamber preceded by the Sergeant-at-Arms.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor took the Chair.

His Honour was then pleased to open the Session with a Speech From the Throne.

His Honour then left the Assembly Chamber.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

On motion of the Honourable the President of the Council and by leave of the House, a Bill entitled, "An Act Respecting The Office Of The Auditor General And The Auditing Of The Public Accounts Of The Province", was introduced and read a first time.

On motion it was ordered the said Bill be read a second time on tomorrow.

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Mr. Speaker announced that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor had been pleased to make a Speech to the Members met in the General Assembly and that for greater accuracy he had obtained a copy.

It was unanimously agreed that the Speech should be taken as read.

It was moved by the Honourable the Member for LaPoile and seconded by the Honourable the Member for Placentia that an Address of Thanks be presented to His Honour in reply to the Gracious Speech with which he had been pleased to open the present Session of the Legislature and that a Select Committee be appointed to draft such Address In Reply.

It was ordered accordingly that the following Members be appointed to the said Committee:

Mr. William Hogan, Placentia
Mrs. Shannie Duff, St. John's East

The Honourable the Leader of the Opposition gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the Newfoundland and Labrador economy has worsened dramatically since this Government took office almost one year ago and unemployment has increased;

AND WHEREAS the economic diversification of the Newfoundland and Labrador economy is a worthy and proper goal for the Province;

AND WHEREAS the maintenance of rural Newfoundland and Labrador will depend largely on the fishery, notwithstanding economic diversification;

AND WHEREAS the Government has created an Economic Recovery Commission to which it intends to transfer all of its economic powers and its ability to influence the economic direction of the province;

AND WHEREAS the Government has committed that it plans to bring in an economic recovery plan but to date has not done so;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House:

- a) call on the Government to immediately produce its economic recovery plan for the consideration of the House of Assembly;
- b) express its concern about the centralization of power in a non-elected and unaccountable commission.

The Honourable the Member for Bellevue gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the seven Women's Centres in Newfoundland and Labrador are a meeting place for women and a focal point for activities relating to reaching the goal of women's equality;

AND WHEREAS Women's Centres have brought to the public's attention issues such as wife family violence, equal pay for work of equal value, child care, child sexual abuse, and provided the impetus for women to become actively involved in the economic development of their communities;

AND WHEREAS Women's Centres have contributed to the development of transition houses for battered women and their children;

AND WHEREAS Women's Centres provide counselling and support to victims of sexual assault, single mothers on low income, women going through divorce or separation, and other women in crisis;

AND WHEREAS Women's Centres have brought over \$2,235,519 to the province since their inception and created over 273 jobs and/or training spaces;

AND WHEREAS provincial funding for women's issues has increased over the last ten years;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House deplore the action of the federal government in attempting to deprive women of their centres, and recommend the immediate reinstatement of operational funding to the seven centres in this province.

The Honourable the Member for Grand Bank gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the fishery is the economic mainstay of Newfoundland and Labrador;

AND WHEREAS for many parts of the province, the fishery is the only employer and it is not possible to fully replace the employment lost as a result of the closing of a plant, through economic diversification;

AND WHEREAS the current crisis, with proper management, is a short term one, and the stocks will eventually rebuild;

AND WHEREAS the present Government is using the current short term crisis to down-size and rationalize the fishery which will result in dramatic centralization and loss of population in rural Newfoundland;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House support:

- a) an all plants open approach; and
- b) urge the Government to work with the Federal Government to develop a financial package which will enable the plants due to be closed to be kept open until the stocks rebuild.

The Honourable the Member for Pleasantville gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the Government of Canada is proposing to implement a consumption tax on goods and services;

AND WHEREAS such a tax is likely to have serious negative effects on our country at a time when our economy may be particularly vulnerable;

AND WHEREAS there are preferable and more equitable means of reducing the deficit improving our competitiveness, and replacing necessary revenue lost through elimination of the manufacturers sales tax;

AND WHEREAS the regressive effects of the proposed goods and services tax would be disproportionately burdensome to Newfoundlanders and Labradorians;

AND WHEREAS the GST will be expensive to collect, difficult to administer, and confusing to consumers;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House demand that the Government of Canada not proceed with implementation of the goods and services tax.

The Honourable the Member for Burin - Placentia West gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS amalgamation of municipalities in certain circumstances may well be a good approach;

AND WHEREAS the Government is attempting to force the amalgamation of municipalities against the will of many municipalities and the residents of these municipalities;

AND WHEREAS many of the amalgamation proposals of the Government are ill conceived;

AND WHEREAS the public hearing process conducted by senior officials of the Department of Municipal and Provincial Affairs is fundamentally flawed and these officials are in a conflict of interest;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House support the principle that amalgamation should not be forced upon municipalities which do not wish to be amalgamated.

The Honourable the Member for Trinity - Bay de Verde gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the Atlantic Fishery has experienced a 25% reduction in the total allowable catch for Northern Cod since 1989;

AND WHEREAS the Resource Short Plant Program plays a significant role in providing seasonal employment;

AND WHEREAS the Resource Short Plant Program has experienced a 60% cut in its allocation over last year;

AND WHEREAS these cuts have not been made on a proportional or pro rata basis;

AND WHEREAS the Inshore quota has been cut by 4,000 tons as a result of the quota for the Middle Distance Fleet being eliminated;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Government continue its efforts to increase the quota for the Resource Short Plant Program to, at minimum, the pro rata level;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Provincial Government attempt to get the quota for the Middle Distance fleet reinstated without a reduction in the Inshore Total Allowable Catch.

The Honourable the Member for St. John's East Extern gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the Government has proposed a new Crown Lands Act which will result in the loss of the traditional rights of Newfoundlanders and Labradorians to have unlimited access to the lakes, ponds and rivers of the Province;

AND WHEREAS such a right has existed in our Crown Lands Act for almost 40 years; and was a traditional right long before that legislation;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House reaffirm the traditional rights of Newfoundlanders and Labradorians to unlimited access to their lakes, ponds and rivers and that the new Crown Lands Act, when it is reintroduced, be amended so as to delete the present controversial Clause 7(2).

The Honourable the Member for Eagle River gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS coastal Labradorians are totally dependent upon the fishery for their livelihood;

AND WHEREAS not one fish of the Northern Cod stock is allocated to Labrador fish companies;

AND WHEREAS not one inshore shrimp license is allocated to Labrador fishermen;

AND WHEREAS less than one percent of the total provincial caplin quota is allocated to Labrador;

AND WHEREAS 80 percent of the inshore fish in Labrador is taken to Quebec and other parts of the Island for processing;

AND WHEREAS not one salt fish is dried on the Labrador Coast;

AND WHEREAS no Labradorian gets more than 12 weeks processing the greatest fishing resources in Canada;

BE IT RESOLVED that this House endorse the principle of adjacency as adopted by this government and that those closest to the resource must get the greatest benefit;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this House condemn the Federal Government for its actions to date and demand that a comprehensive development and management plan for the Labrador fishery be implemented.

The Honourable the Member for Green Bay gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS both Newfoundland Light and Power and Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro have indicated that there will be substantial increases in the cost of electricity;

AND WHEREAS the subsidy for the Power Distribution Districts is being eliminated, thereby increasing the cost of electricity;

AND WHEREAS the Government has stated that it may eliminate the exemption for electricity from retail sales tax;

AND WHEREAS the subsidy for the Power Distribution Districts is being eliminated, thereby increasing the cost of electricity;

AND WHEREAS the Government has stated that it may eliminate the exemption for electricity from retail sales tax;

AND WHEREAS an independent Public Utilities Board is essential to ensure that increases in electricity rates are kept to a minimum;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House:

- a) call on the Government to reinstate the subsidy for the Power Distribution Districts; and
- b) oppose the proposal to remove the exemption for electricity from retail sales tax.

The Honourable the Member for Stephenville gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the skills and knowledge of Newfoundlanders and Labradorians will be a critical factor in determining the future success of our province as a vibrant society and a viable economy;

AND WHEREAS the post secondary education system in today's challenging environment must provide the women and men in the province with high quality advanced education, delivered in an accessible and efficient manner;

AND WHEREAS the White Paper outlining a post secondary educational agenda for the future has been announced by the Minister of Education and stresses equality, excellence and efficiency in the post secondary system;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Assembly express support for the White Paper Educational Initiative put forward by the Wells Administration.

The Honourable the Member for Humber East gave notice that she would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS there is an alarmingly high incidence of sexual assault and domestic violence in Canada, including Newfoundland and Labrador;

AND WHEREAS the victims of these crimes are almost exclusively children and women;

AND WHEREAS the rate of disclosure of these crimes to child welfare officials and the police has been rising;

AND WHEREAS there is a need for immediate improvements in our criminal justice, social and health care services to give victims and survivors the assistance and support they need, and to deal effectively with offenders;

AND WHEREAS there is a need for our society to develop a greater understanding of the causes of personal crimes against children and women, and for the government to lead the way in preventing these crimes;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the government proceed immediately with the following steps to improve services and support to victims and survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence:

- a) the Department of Justice hire victim court workers for each of the province's major court centres;
- b) the Department of Social Services increase the number of front-line social workers;
- c) the Department of Social Services fund resource centres for adult survivors of child sexual assault;
- d) the Department of Social Services increase funding for Iris Kirby House in St. John's, the Transition House in Corner Brook and Libra House in Happy Valley - Goose Bay;
- e) the Department of Social Services fund new transition houses for battered women and children in Labrador West, Gander and any other places where there is a demonstrated need;
- f) The Department of Health expand mental health services for children and adolescents, and establish these services in each region of the province.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Government commission a task force to conduct a major multi-disciplinary study on sexual assault and family violence to provide guidance to the public and the Government on changes that must come about to prevent these crimes;

and to advise the Government on what programs and services should be provided to victims and survivors, and to offenders.

The Honourable the Member for Mount Scio - Bell Island gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the tourism industry is a vital part of our province's economic recovery;

AND WHEREAS tourism is the fastest growing industry in our province with development potential not only during the normal summer season but with tremendous potential in the winter months through ski facilities and other winter activities;

AND WHEREAS tourism has the potential to create and meet the much needed employment in our province in both the near and distant future;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Government continue its efforts to establish a new Tourism Subsidiary Agreement for the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador and thus stimulate the development of the tourism industry and tourism related infra-structure so as to meet the demands of visitors and tourism in our province.

The Honourable the Member for Harbour Main gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS many collective agreements are expiring this year in the private and public sector;

AND WHEREAS a good labour relations climate in both the public and private sector is essential to economic growth in the Province and proper public administration and the delivery of public services;

AND WHEREAS the present administration has failed to foster such a good labour relations climate;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House urge the Government to foster a good labour relations climate in the Province and it negotiate in good faith with its own employees to ensure that public services are not disrupted in the coming year.

The Honourable the Member for Ferryland gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the Premier of Newfoundland and Labrador has stated that if the Meech Lake Accord is passed then Newfoundland and Labrador will be permanently impoverished;

AND WHEREAS the Premier has stated that if this happens then "we may well be a good deal better off as citizens of the United States of America";

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Newfoundland Economic Recovery Commission be empowered to immediately begin an assessment of the economic and social advantages of joining the United States of America;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if and when this Commission ascertains that these assumptions are fundamentally false then the Premier will:

- a) remove all objections to the Meech Lake Accord;
- b) immediately begin the process of ensuring that Newfoundland and Labrador take its rightful and equal place within the Canadian Confederation.

The Honourable the Member for Mount Pearl gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the Hibernia Statement of Principles forms the foundation for the formal legal agreements necessary for the release of the Hibernia project;

AND WHEREAS the proposed design for the Gravity Based Structure has changed since the signing of the Statement of Principles;

AND WHEREAS the objectives of the industrial benefits package of the Statement of Principles provide substantial economic advantages to Newfoundland and Labrador;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House direct the Government to ensure that the objectives of the industrial benefits package of the Statement of Principles are maintained in its finalization of the Hibernia Agreement, and that industrial benefits are spread throughout Newfoundland and Labrador as much as possible.

The Honourable the Member for Humber Valley gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the agricultural industry in this Province has not been developed to its fullest potential;

AND WHEREAS an expanded agricultural industry in this province would provide much of the diversification our economy needs;

AND WHEREAS the present Government has not acted to expand or to facilitate the expansion of this Province's agricultural industry;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Honourable House urge the Government to develop and implement a comprehensive plan to facilitate the growth of the agricultural industry so that this industry may fulfill its potential and take its place among the major industries in Newfoundland and Labrador.

The Honourable the Member for St. John's East gave notice that she would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the present Government of this Province when in Opposition criticized the former Government for undue economic restraint in the health care sector;

AND WHEREAS the present Government has promised to provide high quality health care for all residents of Newfoundland and Labrador regardless of the cost;

AND WHEREAS the need for home care services in this Province is great and has not been adequately addressed by the present Government.

AND WHEREAS the former Government had already undertaken initiatives aimed at improving the quality of health care in this Province by increasing the availability of diagnostic services to medical professionals and by addressing health care staff shortages;

AND WHEREAS the present Government has failed to continue the initiatives undertaken by the former Government aimed at improving the quality of health care in this Province;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Honourable House urge the present Government to fulfill its commitment to provide high quality health care for all residents of Newfoundland and Labrador, the provision of which shall preclude health care staff shortages, hospital bed closures and unreasonable delays for hospital admissions and for surgery;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT this Honourable House urge the present Government to ensure the provision of home care services to all residents of Newfoundland and Labrador who from time to time need those services.

The Honourable the Member for Fogo gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the Government's responsibility for recreation has been absorbed in the Department of Municipal and Provincial Affairs along with many other responsibilities which are not directly related to recreation;

AND WHEREAS the Government has not developed a comprehensive plan for the construction of regional recreational facilities throughout Newfoundland and Labrador;

AND WHEREAS funding for recreation under the present Government has been unbalanced in favour of districts which are represented in the House of Assembly by Liberal Members;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Government develop and implement without delay a comprehensive plan for the construction of regional recreational facilities in Newfoundland and Labrador;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Government allocate all funding which has been designated for recreation, according to need in a fair and balanced manner;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Government implement the construction plan for recreational facilities developed in April of 1989.

The Honourable the Member for Kilbride gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the Government of Canada is responsible to provide an efficient and equitable postal service for all residents of Canada;

AND WHEREAS Canadians pay for this postal service whether they reside in urban or rural Canada;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Canada, through Canada Post Corporation, has resolved to downgrade postal service to many rural Canadian communities including towns in this Province;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador lobby the Government of Canada to maintain and improve existing postal service at the federal post offices in this Province.

The Honourable the Member for Torngat Mountains gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

WHEREAS health is of utmost importance to all Newfoundlanders and Labradorians;


AND WHEREAS the health status of the aboriginal people of Labrador is below Canadian standards;

AND WHEREAS the health status is closely associated with social and economic conditions;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador take steps in conjunction with the Federal Government to transfer the administration and control of Health and Social programs to the native associations of Labrador.

On motion it was ordered that when the House rises it adjourn until tomorrow, Monday, March 12th at two of the clock.

WHEREAS by a Resolution dated the 7th day of July, 1988, the House of Assembly of the Province of Newfoundland resolved that an amendment to the Constitution of Canada be authorized to be made by proclamation issued by Her Excellency the Governor General under the Great Seal of Canada in accordance with amendments set out in the schedule attached thereto.

AND WHEREAS this House does not agree that the amendment authorized will achieve its stated purpose of recognizing the principle of equality of all the provinces or providing new arrangements that will foster greater harmony and co-operation between the Government of Canada and the governments of the provinces;

AND WHEREAS the Government of this Province is concerned that the overall long term effect of implementation of the said amendment will be to continue indefinitely the regional economic disparity that presently exists in Canada;

AND WHEREAS this House shares those concerns and the grave concerns of certain provinces and various interest groups and concerned citizens that the authorized amendment may be interpreted to diminish guaranteed rights under the Charter of Rights and Freedoms, to create a special legislative status for one province, to reduce or erode effective national shared cost programs, to render effective Senate reform virtually impossible, and to inhibit the governments and legislatures of Canada from honouring the commitments to promote equal opportunities for the well-being of Canadians, to reduce disparity in opportunities and to provide essential public services of reasonable quality to all Canadians as set out in section 36(1) of the Constitution Act 1982;

AND WHEREAS Section 46(2) of the Constitution Act, 1982 specifically provides that a resolution of assent made for purposes of amending the Constitution of Canada may be revoked at any time before the issue of a proclamation authorized by it;

NOW THEREFORE the House of Assembly of the Province of Newfoundland pursuant to Section 46(2) of the Constitution Act, 1982 resolves that the Resolution to authorize the amendment to the Constitution of Canada adopted and approved on the 7th day of July, 1988, be and it is hereby revoked;

AND the House of Assembly of the Province of Newfoundland further resolves that an amendment to the Constitution of Canada be authorized to be made by proclamation issued by His Excellency the Governor General under the Great Seal of Canada in accordance with the schedule hereto either:

upon approval of the said amendment by a majority of the electors of Newfoundland and Labrador in a province-wide referendum; or

upon approval of the said amendment by a majority of the electors of Canada in a nation-wide referendum, notwithstanding that approval may have been rejected in a previous province-wide referendum;

and the Speaker is hereby authorized, upon receipt by the Speaker of a certificate from the official designated by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, or the Governor General in Council, as the case may be, confirming that any such referendum approved the said amendment by an absolute majority of valid votes cast, to certify to His Excellency the Governor General authorization of the said amendment by this House.

AND the House of Assembly of the Province of Newfoundland further resolves to authorize and hereby authorized the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council to provide for such a province-wide referendum, if it is deemed necessary, and conduct the same either as a plebiscite under section 169 of the Election Act or in such other manner and at such time as the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council shall prescribe.

WHEREAS the Province of Quebec was not a signatory to the patriation of the Constitution in 1982;

AND WHEREAS the Government of New Brunswick has introduced a resolution to ratify the Meech Lake Constitutional Accord in their legislature together with a resolution to further amend the Constitution;

AND WHEREAS this initiative undertaken by the Government of New Brunswick is a constructive proposal which may lead to the ratification of the Meech Lake Constitutional Accord and may allow for further constitutional reforms;

AND WHEREAS it is important that no precipitate action be taken by any one jurisdiction to foreclose the possibility of a successful conclusion to the process which is now underway to salvage the Meech Lake Constitutional Accord;

AND WHEREAS any action taken by the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador which would have the effect of rescinding the approval by this Honourable House of the Meech Lake Constitutional Accord would be unhelpful in bringing about a successful conclusion to present constitutional reform process;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Honourable House commend the Government of New Brunswick for its conciliatory approach to the resolution of the current constitutional impasse;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Honourable House urge the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador to adopt an equally constructive and flexible constitutional position, and work with the Governments of Canada and the Governments of the other provinces to bring Quebec fully into the Canadian constitutional family;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador refrain from proceeding with a resolution which would have the effect of rescinding the approval by this Honourable House of the Meech Lake Constitutional Accord.

AND the House of Assembly of the Province of Newfoundland further resolves that an amendment to the Constitution of Canada be authorized to be made by proclamation issued by His Excellency the Governor General under the Great Seal of Canada in accordance with Schedule A hereto:

SCHEDULE A

CONSTITUTION AMENDMENT,
1987

Constitution Act, 1867

1. The *Constitution Act, 1867* is amended by adding thereto, immediately after section 1 thereof, the following section:

“2. (1) The Constitution of Canada shall be interpreted in a manner consistent with

(4) Nothing in this section derogates from the powers, rights or privileges of Parliament or the Government of Canada, or of the legislatures or governments of the provinces, including any powers, rights or privileges relating to language."

2. The said Act is further amended by adding thereto, immediately after section 24 thereof, the following section:

"25. (1) Where a vacancy occurs in the Senate, the government of the province to which the vacancy relates may, in relation to that vacancy, submit to the Queen's Privy Council for Canada the names of persons who may be summoned to the Senate.

(2) Until an amendment to the Constitution of Canada is made in relation to the Senate pursuant to section 41 of the *Constitution Act, 1982*, the person summoned to fill a vacancy in the Senate shall be chosen from among persons

The Government of Canada shall, at the request of the government of any province, negotiate with the government of that province for the purpose of concluding an agreement relating to immigration or the temporary admission of aliens into that province that is appropriate to the needs and circumstances of that province.

95B. (1) Any agreement concluded between Canada and a province in relation to immigration or the temporary admission of aliens into that province has the force of law from the time it is declared to do so in accordance with subsection 95C(1) and shall from that time have effect notwithstanding class 25 of section 91 or section 95.

(2) An agreement that has the force of law under subsection (1) shall have effect only so long and so far as it is not repugnant to any provision of an Act of the Parliament of Canada that sets national standards and objectives relating to immigration or aliens, including any provision that establishes general classes of immigrants or relates to levels of immigration for Canada or that prescribes classes of individuals who are inadmissible into Canada.

(3) The *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms* applies in respect of any agreement that has the force of law under subsection (1) and in respect of

(1) A declaration that an agreement referred to in subsection 95B(1) has the force of law may be made by proclamation issued by the Governor General under the Great Seal of Canada only where so authorized by resolutions of the Senate and House of Commons and of the legislative assembly of the province that is a party to the agreement.

(2) An amendment to an agreement referred to in subsection 95B(1) may be made by proclamation issued by the Governor General under the Great Seal of Canada only where so authorized

- (a) by resolutions of the Senate and House of Commons and of the legislative assembly of the province that is a party to the agreement; or
- (b) in such other manner as is set out in the agreement.

95D. Sections 46 to 48 of the *Constitution Act, 1982* apply, with such modifications as the circumstances require, in respect of any declaration made pursuant to subsection 95C(1), any amendment to an agreement made pursuant to subsection 95C(2) or any amendment made pursuant to section 95E.

95E. An amendment to sections 95A to 95D or this section may be made in accordance with the procedure set out in subsection 38(1) of the *Constitution Act, 1982*, but only if the amendment is authorized by resolutions of the legislative assemblies of all the provinces that are, at the time of the amendment, parties to an agreement that has the force of law under subsection 95B(1).''

(2) Where an appointment is made to the Supreme Court of Canada, the Governor General in Council shall, except where the Chief Justice is appointed from among members of the Court, appoint a person whose name has been submitted under subsection (1) and who is acceptable to the Queen's Privy Council for Canada.

(3) Where an appointment is made in accordance with subsection (2) of any of three judges necessary to meet the requirement set out in subsection 101B(2), the Governor General in Council shall appoint a person whose name has been submitted by the Government of Quebec.

(4) Where an appointment is made in accordance with subsection (2) otherwise than as required under subsection (3), the Governor General in Council shall appoint a person whose name has been submitted by the government of a province other than Quebec.

101D. Sections 99 and 100 apply in respect of the judges of the Supreme Court of Canada.

101E. (1) Sections 101A to 101D shall not be construed as abrogating or derogating from the powers of the Parliament of Canada to make laws under section 101 except to the extent that such laws are inconsistent with those sections.

(1) The Government of Canada shall provide reasonable compensation to the government of a province that chooses not to participate in a national shared-cost program that is established by the Government of Canada after the coming into force of this section in an area of exclusive provincial jurisdiction, if the province carries on a program or initiative that is compatible with the national objectives.

(2) Nothing in this section extends the legislative powers of the Parliament of Canada or of the legislatures of the provinces."

8. The said Act is further amended by adding thereto the following heading and sections:

"XII—CONFERENCES ON THE ECONOMY AND OTHER MATTERS

148. A conference composed of the Prime Minister of Canada and the first ministers of the provinces shall be convened by the Prime Minister of Canada at least once each year to discuss the state of the Canadian economy and such other matters as may be appropriate.

XIII—REFERENCES

149. A reference to this Act shall be deemed to include a reference to any amendments thereto."

- (d) the right of a province to a number of members in the House of Commons not less than the number of Senators by which the province was entitled to be represented on April 17, 1982;
- (e) the principle of proportionate representation of the provinces in the House of Commons prescribed by the Constitution of Canada;

"46. (1) The procedures for amendment under sections 38, 41 and 43 may be initiated either by the Senate or the House of Commons or by the legislative assembly of a province."

(1) An amendment to the Constitution of Canada made by proclamation under section 38, 41 or 43 may be made without a resolution of the Senate authorizing the issue of the proclamation if, within one hundred and eighty days after the adoption by the House of Commons of a resolution authorizing its issue, the Senate has not adopted such a resolution and if, at any time after the expiration of that period, the House of Commons again adopts the resolution."

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

My Government was most pleased that in September of this past year, the two orders of Government and the oil companies involved in offshore development reached an agreement with respect to the Hibernia Project. During the course of this Session, a number of Bills were enacted to facilitate the Province's commitment to the Hibernia Project.

Since my last address to this Honourable House of Assembly, upon the recommendation of the Economic Recovery Commission and the Department of Development, my Government's hope that this new Crown Corporation which restructured the Newfoundland and Labrador Department Corporation and certain functions of the Department of Development will provide a single Crown Agency for all local development and business support programs offered by my Government. This Crown Corporation will also provide the overall planning and co-ordination function for Government departments, agencies and other organizations which have an impact on economic development in the various regions of this Province.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

In keeping with my Government's desire to encourage and continue the development of resource industries, this Honourable House of Assembly passed An Act to authorize certain agreements between my Government and other parties respecting the future operation of the Corner Brook Newsprint Mill.

A new Forestry Act was enacted. Although this Act revises and consolidates the existing law with respect to the forest resources in the Province, it also provides for a comprehensive system of forest management, it stream-lines the enforcement of the current Forest Land Management and Taxation Act, it modernizes the law with respect to the protection of our forests from hazards such as insects and fires and it provides a new mechanism for the enforcement of the law through the use of violation tickets for certain offences.

In the area of transportation, my Government introduced a Bill that revised the law respecting the regulation of the motor carrier industry in the Province. As well, The Highway Traffic Act, 1988 was amended to facilitate the implementation of the demerit point system and to increase the penalties under that Act to provide a greater deterrence in protecting the lives of our citizens.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

As part of my Government's commitment to reform, my Government introduced amendments to: The Adoption of Children Act, The Day Care and Homemaker Services Act, 1975, The Child Welfare Act, 1972 and The Young Persons Offences Act. With respect to The Adoption of Children Act, the law provides for the release of information under certain circumstances in order to assist adopted persons in locating their natural parents.

In the area of municipal affairs, my Government introduced amendments to The Assessment Act, 1986, The Urban and Rural Planning Act, and The Municipalities Act. My Government also introduced a Bill to provide for the creation of regional service boards throughout the Province.

In the area of the administration of justice, my Government introduced a revision to the law respecting the sale of securities in the Province. In response to a Report of the Newfoundland Law Reform Commission, a Bill was enacted to reform the common law respecting enduring powers of attorney. The Small Claims Act was amended to increase the monetary jurisdiction from one thousand to three thousand dollars. In order to convenience those who appear before the Crimes Compensation Board, The Criminal Injuries Compensation Act was amended so that individual Board members may be empowered to conduct hearings in different parts of the Province. The Registration of Deeds Act was amended to authorize the use of a computer system for document registration and to provide other housekeeping changes to convenience the public.

Ever mindful of the changes in the field of medicine, my Government introduced a new Chiropractors Act. This Act will ensure that the practice of chiropractic is regulated so that those citizens wishing to avail of the services of a chiropractor, will be assured of receiving professional help. Other health

related Acts amended during this Session were: The Welfare Institutions Act, The Department of Health Act and The Western Memorial Hospital Act, 1947.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

I thank you for the large measure of supply you have granted. I assure you that the appropriations that you have granted have been and will be expended by my Ministers with care and efficiency, and will be distributed with fairness and balance for the betterment of all people in this Province.

It is my pleasure that the Second Session of this 41st General Assembly now be prorogued and it is prorogued accordingly.
