As required under the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act*, the Speaker reported the following decisions made at an *in camera* meeting held on May 30, 2017:

CM 2017-051 The Commission, at an *in camera* meeting, approved the compensation level for the position of Seniors' Advocate at EP-29 of the Executive Pay Plan.

As required under the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act*, the Speaker reported the following decisions made at an *in camera* meeting held on September 7, 2017:

CM 2017-052 The Commission, at an *in camera* meeting, approved the appointment of Ms. Kim Hawley-George as Law Clerk in a temporary capacity effective October 2, 2017 for a period not to exceed 12 consecutive months or until the position is permanently filled.

As required under the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act*, the Speaker reported the following decisions made at an *in camera* meeting, held prior to the televised meeting:

- CM 2017-053 The Commission, at an *in camera* meeting, recommended the appointment of Ms. Sandra Russell, CPA, CA in an acting capacity as Auditor General, until such time as the position is filled on a permanent basis. Remuneration is set at EP 10, Step 18.
- CM 2017-054 The Commission, at an *in camera* meeting, approved a pre-commitment of funds up to \$20,000 for the Canadian Conference of Election Officials.
- CM 2017-055 The Commission, at an *in camera* meeting, approved a pre-commitment of funds up to \$20,000 for the Canadian Conflict of Interest Network Conference.
- CM 2017-056 The Commission, at an *in camera* meeting, approved a pre-commitment of funds for the 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20 budget appropriations for consulting services for the audit of the Office of the Auditor General.
- CM 2017-057 In order to give immediate effect to CM 2017-056, the Commission waived the usual two day waiting period for Management Commission decisions.
- CM 2017-058 The Commission approved a pre-commitment of funds for the 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20 budget appropriations for consulting services for the management certification process.
- CM 2017-059 In order to give immediate effect to CM 2017-058, the Commission waived the usual two day waiting period for Management Commission decisions.
- **CM 2017-060** The Minutes of the House of Assembly Management Commission meeting held on May 17, 2017 were approved as read.

As required under the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act*, the Speaker reported rulings on allowance use for the period ended October 11, 2017. The reported expenditure of \$171.73 for the Member for Lewisporte-Twillingate was rejected for payment because it was not submitted within 60-days of being made; however it was a permitted expense and complied with all other provisions of the *Members' Resources and Allowances Rules*.

The report of all budget transfer processed during the period of April 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017 were provided to the Commission for Review.

The financial reports for the Legislature for the periods April 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017; and April 1, 2017 to September 30, 2017 were provided to the Commission for review. The Members' Accountability and Disclosure Reports were provided for the same periods.

The Caucus Operational Funding Expenditure Reports for the period April 1, 2016 - March 31, 2017 for the Office of the Speaker, Government Members' Caucus, Official Opposition Caucus and the Third Party Caucus were submitted to the Commission for review.

CM 2017-061 Pursuant to subsection 43(2) of the *House of Assembly, Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act*, the Commission appointed the Auditor General as auditor of the House of Assembly and Statutory Offices for the year ending 31 March 2018.

Pursuant to paragraph 23(8)(c) of the *House of Assembly, Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act*, the Tenth Report of the Audit Committee was provided to the Commission for review.

CM 2017-062 The Commission approved the audited financial information for April 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017 for the House of Assembly and its Statutory Offices as recommended by the Audit Committee.

Pursuant to 32(3) of the *Auditor General Act*, the audited financial information for the Office of the Auditor General for the fiscal year ended 31 March 2017 was provided to the Commission for review.

CM 2017-063 The Commission approved the payment of expenses totaling \$300.00 for the Member for Bonavista, with the expenses to be paid within the appropriate allocation for the 2017-18 fiscal year.

CM 2017-064 The Commission rejected payment of advertising expenses totaling \$115.00 for the Member for Exploits.

Approval of the consolidated Severance Policy for Members of the House of Assembly was deferred to the next meeting of the Commission so that House officials can draft a definition for transition period.

CM 2017-065 The Commission rescinded CM 2016-074 which adopted recommendation 12 of the 2016 Members' Compensation Review Committee.

CM 2017-066 Pursuant to subparagraph 20(6)(b)(ii) of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity* and Administration Act, the Commission approved the proposed amendments to the Advertising and Publications Policy for Members of the House of Assembly.

CM 2017-067 Pursuant to Section 64 of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act*, the Commission approved the following amendment to Section 24 *Members' Resources and Allowances Rules*, subject to final wording by the Office of the Legislative Counsel:

Section 24 of the *Members' Resources and Allowances Rules* is repealed and the following substituted:

Office operations, supplies and communications allowance

- 24. (1) A member may claim against the office operations and supplies allowance for reimbursement to cover operational costs of operating a constituency office including,
 - (a) office supplies;
 - (b) printing;
 - (c) photocopies;
 - (d) newspapers;
 - (e) answering services;
 - (f) staff professional development;
 - (g) courier services and postage;
 - (h) database maintenance;
 - (i) advertising in the form and with the content outlined in the policies of the commission;
 - (j) special occasion cards;
 - (k) those other items identified and directed by the commission
 - (2) For the purpose of subsection (1), "special occasion cards" mean anniversary, birthday or sympathy cards, but does not include Christmas cards or other seasonal cards.
- CM 2017-068 The Commission approved payment of the invoice totaling \$792.26 for the constituency office for the District of Placentia-St. Mary's.
- CM 2017-069 Pursuant to subparagraph 20(6)(b)(ii) of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity* and Administration Act, the Commission approved an amendment to the <u>Standard Office Allocation Package for Members of the House of Assembly and Constituency</u>

<u>Assistants</u> to increase the maximum amount for pre-approval by the Clerk to \$1000, with the Clerk to report all such approvals at the next meeting of the Management Commission.

House of Assembly Management Commission Briefing Note

<u>Title:</u> 2016 Members' Compensation Review Committee (MCRC) Implementation

<u>Issue:</u> Severance Policy for Members of the House of Assembly

Background:

- On December 7, 2016, the Management Commission accepted recommendations 31-38 of the 2016 MCRC Report with respect to severance for Members of the House of Assembly (CM 2016-062 to CM 2016-069 refer).
- On March 15, 2017, the Management Commission accepted recommendation 44 of the 2016 MCRC Report that the new severance provisions shall not apply to Members of the House of Assembly who were elected before November 30, 2015 (CM 2017-025 refers).
- The draft <u>Severance Policy for Members of the House of Assembly</u> (attached) is a consolidation of severance provisions for Members. The severance provisions in effect for Members who were elected prior to November 30, 2015 are included in the draft policy under Section 4.0. The severance provisions applicable to those elected on or after November 30, 2015 are included in Section 5.0.
- MCRC Recommendation 33 (CM2016-0064 refers) stated that **severance shall be paid monthly during the transition period**. However, the transition period was not defined.
- On November 8, 2017, the Commission considered several options with respect to defining transition period and directed House officials to draft a definition for consideration that set a minimum and maximum timeframe for the transition period, chosen at the discretion of the Member.
- The draft definition for transition period is included in the attached consolidated policy under Section 5.6; and under the Options section of this note.
- MCRC recommendation 37 (**CM 2016-068** refers), which is only applicable to those elected on or after November 30, 2015, stated that severance benefits shall cease during the transition period should any circumstance occur as now outlined in section 5.6 of the policy.
- Due to the difficulty in monitoring actions of former Members during the transition period, it is the duty of outgoing Members to notify the Legislature should one of those circumstances occur. Members will be required to sign an affidavit to this effect.

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1.0 Introduction

Under the authority of paragraph 11(3)(a) and subparagraph 20(6)(b)(ii) of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act* (the Act), the House of Assembly Management Commission establishes this policy respecting severance for Members of the House of Assembly.

2.0 Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish guidelines to ensure that severance paid to Members of the House of Assembly is done in accordance with the parameters accepted and approved by the House of Assembly Management Commission.

3.0 Applicability

The severance provisions outlined in **Section 4.0** of this policy apply only to those Members who were **first elected before** November 30, 2015.

The severance provisions outlined in **Section 5.0** of this policy apply only to those Members **first elected on or after** November 30, 2015.

3.1 Breaks in Service

If a Member is re-elected following a break in service, prior service for which severance has already been paid is not counted towards years of service for future severance. The Member shall be considered as commencing his/her first General Assembly, regardless of how many Assemblies he/she may have served previously.

4.0 Members First Elected <u>Before</u> November 30, 2015

4.1 Eligibility

A Member who resigns, retires or is defeated is eligible for severance.

4.2 Definition of Salary

For the purpose of calculating severance under this section, salary is 81.2% of the Member's gross salary as established in section 11 of the Act Salaries paid to a Member for occupying a Legislative Office are not included in the calculation of severance.

4.3 Calculation

Severance shall be calculated at one month salary for each year of MHA service and prorated for part of the year's service, to a maximum of 12 months and with a minimum of 3 months.

4.4 Payment

Severance is paid as a lump sum within the same fiscal year of the Member's termination.

5.0 Members First Elected On/After November 30, 2015

5.1 Eligibility

A Member must serve at least 3 years in order to be eligible for severance.

Any Member who is disqualified from being a Member pursuant to Part V of the Act other than the failure to be re-elected or the resignation of his/her seat, is not eligible to receive severance.

5.2 Definition of Salary

For the purpose of calculating severance under this section, severance is based on the salary payable to a Member as established in section 11 of the Act. Salaries paid to a Member for occupying a Legislative Office are not included in the calculation of severance.

5.3 Calculation

Severance shall be calculated as follows:

- If the Member's service ends at the conclusion of his/her 1st General Assembly, 20% of the Member's salary is payable as severance;
- If the Member's service ends at the conclusion of his/her 2nd General Assembly, 50% of the Member's salary is payable as severance;
- If the Member's service ends at the conclusion of his/her 3rd General Assembly or thereafter, a maximum of 75% of the Member's salary is payable as severance.

If a Member's service ends prior to the end of an Assembly, the severance will be prorated for the years of service.

5.4 Deductions

Severance benefits paid to a Member from any other government source including, but not limited to, severance benefits paid by Executive Council (e.g. the receipt by a Minster of payment upon leaving a Ministerial office and an extended car allowance) shall be deducted from the severance payable to an MHA from the House of Assembly.

The overall severance from all sources must not exceed the maximum severance payable pursuant to subsection 5.2 of this policy.

5.5 Payment

Severance shall be paid monthly during the transition period.

5.6 Cessation

Severance benefits shall cease if, during the **transition period***, a Member:

- a. is eligible to receive a pension sponsored by the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador during the transition period;
- b. obtains fulltime employment with the public sector;
- c. is appointed a provincial or federal judge;
- d. is appointed to the Senate of Canada;
- e. is elected as a Member of the House of Commons;
- f. is appointed Lieutenant-Governor of Newfoundland and Labrador;
- g. is appointed Governor General of Canada.

*The Member may select a transition period that is not less than 3 months, and not greater than 12 months.

Members will be required to sign an affidavit declaring their responsibility to notify the Legislature should one of the above occur during the transition period.

House of Assembly Management Commission Briefing Note

<u>Title:</u> Budget Transfer Request

Issue: Approval of a Transfer of Funds to Hansard and Broadcast Centre -

Replacement of Audio

Background:

- The sound system in the Broadcast Centre records the audio of all proceedings, operates the microphones and speakers at the Members' desks, and speakers elsewhere in the Chamber (e.g. public galleries). The sound system is comprised of equipment, software and custom programing of the software so that it integrates with the other components of the broadcasting system.
- There is an urgent need to replace the current system. The system suffered a serious failure in 2014 and repairs at that time were considered temporary. A second serious failure occurred in October 2017. While a repair was successful in time for the opening of the House for the extraordinary sitting of October 16-19, 2017, the repair is unreliable and could fail at any time. The sound system is 13 years old and industry standards suggest the predicted lifespan for this type of equipment is 7-9 years.
- While proceedings could continue in the House without the sound system, there would not be any audio for live or archived broadcasts, webcast, or for Hansard transcription. The record of proceedings would be limited to the Journal only. Members would not have microphones or speakers to transmit or receive audio at their desks; and Members and those in the public gallery would only be able to hear the proceedings as spoken from the Chamber floor.
- In order ensure continuity of operations, equipment must be procured, installed, integrated into the existed broadcasting system and tested in time for the start of the Spring sitting of the Legislature, scheduled for February 26, 2018. The cost to purchase and install the necessary equipment is estimated at \$105,000
- Hansard and the Broadcast Centre, along with other areas in the House of Assembly, have identified savings of approximately \$51,000.
- A transfer of funds of \$54,000 is required for the Broadcast Centre Property, Furnishings and Equipment to provide the additional funding required for the new sound system. Savings to offset this amount have been identified in Members' Resources Allowances and Assistance.

- The Transfer of Funds Policy requires approval of the House of Assembly Management Commission to transfer funds to or from the Grants and Subsidies Main Object of expenditure. Section 4.2.1 of the Transfer of Funds Policy, states:
 - "House of Assembly Management Commission approval is required to transfer funds to or from the following Main Objects of Current Account Expenditure of an Activity:
 - Loans. Advances and Investments:
 - Allowances and Assistance:
 - Grants and Subsidies; and
 - Debt Expenses.

Briefing Note

Title: Request from the Member for Mount Pearl-Southlands

Issue: Request to Amend the House of Assembly Broadcast Guidelines

Background:

- The House of Assembly Broadcast Guidelines respecting the broadcasting of House proceedings were developed by the Speaker and approved by the former Commission of Internal Economy in 2001 when the House adopted broadcasting of proceedings by resolution.
- Clause 18 of the Guidelines (refer Attachment 1) specifies that any matters respecting the televising of debates be referred to the Commission of Internal Economy (now the Management Commission).
- The Member for Mount Pearl-Southlands wrote the Standing Orders Committee requesting that the Broadcast Guidelines be amended to provide split screen views of the House (refer Attachment 2). In accordance with Clause 18 of the Broadcast Guidelines, the request was referred to the Management Commission for consideration and direction.
- The Member is requesting an amendment that would that would allow the broadcast to provide for a split screen view showing both the Member who has been recognized by the Chair and a wide-angle shot showing all Members in the House.
- Current guidelines provide the following direction regarding shots of individual Members:
 - 4. Only the Member who is on his or her feet and has been recognized by the Speaker or the Chairperson of Committees shall be televised.
 - 5. (1) The initial shot of the Member shall be a medium shot (from the waist to just above the head) that will facilitate the keying of a super-graphic. Subsequent shots may include a medium wide shot of the Member that includes some Members who are seated each side of the speaking Member and an occasional wide or extreme wide establishing shot to help orient the television audience.
 - (2) The camera shot of each Member shall be framed in a consistently similar manner approximately from the waist to just above the head.
- Guideline 10(1) prohibits split screen shots.

- The Newfoundland and Labrador guidelines are consistent with those of Canadian legislatures and the House of Commons in that only the Member recognized by the Chair is shown.
- The current cameras and positioning of these cameras in the Chamber produce wide-angle shots that include many, but not all of the Members. The purchase of new equipment and installation to allow for this shot is estimated at \$13,000.
- Using existing equipment and technology, there are two techniques that could be used to create a type of split screen shot, although neither would produce a good quality shot or one that would achieve the intended result:
 - O An image swipe-over technique (see Attachment 3, example 1) would produce part of two images - the Member recognized to speak and a wide-angle shot of part of the Chamber. However, portions of each image would be cut off to the viewer and would not accomplish what the Member is requesting.
 - An image overlay technique (see Attachment 3, example 2) would produce an image of most of the Members in the House in the corner, laid over the image of the Member recognized to speak.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY Newfoundland and Labrador

It is the policy of the House of Assembly, as determined by the Commission of Internal Economy and administered by the Honourable the Speaker, that the regular proceedings of the House of Assembly are to be made available to be broadcast, both audio and video, to the citizens of Newfoundland and Labrador.

It should be noted that broadcasting of the House of Assembly proceedings remains under the exclusive authority of the House of Assembly and the Honourable the Speaker as its Chief Presiding Officer.

The following electronic Hansard guidelines for television coverage of the proceedings of the House of Assembly will ensure that the dignity of the House is respected and that Members are presented fairly and unobtrusively.

In accordance with a Resolution adopted by the Honourable the House of Assembly on November 19th, 2001, the Honourable the Speaker in consultation with the Commission of Internal Economy has made the following television guidelines.

Dated at St. John's, this 19th day of November, 2001.

Television Guidelines

- 1. These guidelines may be cited as the <u>House of Assembly Guidelines</u>, 2001.
- 2. The audio-video coverage of the proceedings of the House of Assembly shall be an accurate, factual and coherent record of the legislative proceedings which is understandable to the viewing public and which does not dramatize or editorialize such proceedings in any way.

- 3. (1) The proceedings in the House of Assembly Chamber beginning with the Speaker calling "Order" (at which time the doors of the Public Galleries are opened) until the daily adjournment of the Assembly shall be telecasted live and also recorded on video tape and may be broadcast by television stations and cablecasters authorized by the House of Assembly. Proceedings in Committee of the Whole House and Committee of Supply shall be included. The Speaker's procession may also be included but not the Private Session.
 - (2) During a recess or the waiting period leading to a division, a wide shot of the Chamber shall be maintained with general ambient audio. Specific audio will be restored for calling of a recorded division.
- 4. Only the Member who is on his or her feet and has been recognized by the Speaker or the Chairperson of Committees shall be televised.
- 5. (1) The initial shot of the Member shall be a medium shot (from the waist to just above the head) that will facilitate the keying of a super-graphic. Subsequent shots may include a medium wide shot of the Member that includes some Members who are seated each side of the speaking Member and an occasional wide or extreme wide establishing shot to help orient the television audience.
 - (2) The camera shot of each Member shall be framed in a consistently similar manner approximately from the waist to just above the head.
- 6. When the Speaker is on his or her feet, the camera directly facing him or her shall be the "on air" camera. A wide shot of the Chamber shall be taken by the same camera and this shot shall be used when the Speaker is on his or her feet and between close-up shots of the Member speaking or during recorded divisions in the Chamber.
- 7. In Committee of the Whole House or Committee of Supply, the wide shot of the Chamber shall be used when the Chairperson of Committees of the Whole House is speaking or during recorded divisions in Committee.
- 8. Medium close up (head and shoulders) shots of the Speaker or the Chairperson in Committee may be taken when he or she is giving a ruling or calling the House to order.
- 9. 'Applause' shots may be taken, however a great deal of care must be exercised to ensure that these are in good taste and reflect the decorum of the Chamber.
- 10. (1) Split-screen, cut-away or reaction shots shall not be permitted.
 - (2) Notwithstanding paragraph 10(1), on special occasions such as the Speech from the Throne on the Opening of a New Session and the Budget Speech, cutaway shots of individuals or groups of Members and guests to the House may be shown.

- 11. Except as provided in paragraph 12, coverage of the legislative proceedings shall be limited to the strict confines of the floor of the House and cameras shall not deliberately record shots of public interruptions and demonstrations
- 12. Medium close-up shots may be taken of visitors sitting in the galleries, as introduced by the Speaker or Chairperson of Committees. These guests must be seated in a predesignated location and the Speaker or the Chair of Committees must instruct the House television personnel in advance of such introductions.
- 13. The House television personnel shall produce and key a super- graphic of the name of the Member, the name of the Member's constituency and his or her party affiliation and in the case of a Minister, his or her portfolio title while he or she is speaking.
- 14. Factual information shall be shown in print across the bottom of the screen from time to time to explain the proceedings. Such information shall be shown only after consultation with the Clerks-at-the-Table.
- 15. Any television programming produced by the House of Assembly may be televised live or by means of video tape by television stations and cablecasters authorized to do so by the House of Assembly. The broadcasts shall be shown with discretion and without any purposeful distortion.
- 16. At the end of each sessional day, the Clerk of the House of Assembly shall ensure that the complete audio-visual record of the day's proceedings is deposited with the Director of Information Management in the Legislative Library. Access to these tapes shall be in accordance with procedures established by the Director of Information Management.
- 17. Pursuant to the provisions of the *Copyright Act* (Canada), the Speaker of the House of Assembly has copyright to the live telecast of and any video taped recordings of the proceedings of the House of Assembly and any Committee of the House.
- 18. These guidelines shall be enforced by the Speaker. Specific complaints by Members regarding the televising of the proceedings in the House of Assembly shall be raised with the Speaker in the Speaker's Chambers. Broad reviews of the whole matter of the televising of the debates shall be referred to the Commission of Internal Economy.
- 19. A breach of these guidelines shall be considered a contempt of the House.

The House met at 10:00 a.m.

Just to advise hon. members so that everybody will be informed as to why we are meeting in this special session this morning: as you know, when we meet at 1:30 this afternoon we will, for the first time, be televising the proceedings of the Legislature and we need authorization from the House to do that, so we have a resolution that will be presented to the House now to deal with that.

MR. LUSH: Mr. Speaker, the resolution is as follows:

Resolution

"Be it Resolved that this House of Assembly do authorize the recording on film and the televising of its proceedings in accordance with guidelines made by the Honourable the Speaker in consultation with the Commission of Internal Economy."

I am writing you in your capacity as Chair of the Standing Orders Committee with regards to two changes I am recommending to proceedings of the House of Assembly as follows:

1. I recommend that the attached House of Assembly Broadcast Guidelines be amended. As per the guidelines, with the exception of some noted situations, when a Member is speaking in the House of Assembly, only he/she as well as the Members sitting around him/her are shown on camera. I believe this should be changed to create a split screen which would show the Member speaking on one part of the screen and the whole House of Assembly on the other. As Members, we all have a responsibility to be in our seats, paying attention to the debate when the House is in session. Anyone who has watched the proceedings from the gallery would know that this is not always the case and quite frankly some of the feedback that I've received from members of the public has not been positive. While there is no doubt that Speaker Osborne has done a great job this past session in improving decorum, it is still not where it needs to be. I believe that having cameras monitoring the whole House as opposed to the just the Member who is speaking and the couple of seats around him/her will greatly improve this situation. In terms of the technology required and associated costs to make this happen, I've visited the House of Assembly Broadcast Center, spoken to staff and

have been shown that this can literally be done with the click of a mouse at no additional costs.

2. My second recommendation relates private members motions. As we know, while these motions exist to provide each Member the opportunity to bring forward an issue of importance to his/her district, traditionally they have been used for political purposes. If the motion is brought in by a government Member, they tend to be riddled with several self- praising WHEREAS clauses and conversely if it is brought in by an opposition Member it is riddled with several provocative WHEREAS clauses condemning the government. Of course, more often than not, when the opposition brings forward a motion that government doesn't like, quite often they will use their majority to make amendments that totally change the whole intent of the original motion. The bottom line here is that private members motions are used more often for political games and oneupmanship than they are for doing the people's business. I am therefore recommending two changes to the current process: 1. totally eliminate the WHEREAS clauses from private members motions and instead have THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED only. WHEREAS clauses are not needed as the Member bringing forward the motion will have plenty of debate time to explain the rationale for the motion. 2. Eliminate the ability to amend a private members motion. If the government or any other non-government MHA doesn't agree with the motion, vote against it. I believe these two measures will take the politics out of PMR's and restore them to the purpose for which they were intended.

I request that you present these recommendations to the Standing Orders Committee for consideration.

<u>Title:</u> Management Commission Meeting Schedule – Winter/Spring 2018

<u>Issue:</u> Setting a meeting schedule in accordance with 2016 MCRC recommendation 52

Background:

• The 2016 Members' Compensation Review Committee (MCRC) made several recommendations with respect to the operations of the Management Commission.

• Recommendation 52, which was accepted by the Commission at its March 15, 2017 meeting (CM 2017-033 refers), states the following:

The Speaker shall:

- i. not set Management Commission meetings that conflict with Cabinet meetings;
- ii. no later than September 15 each year, set a fixed schedule of a minimum of three (3) Management Commission meetings for the Fall, which all members shall make a priority in attending;
- iii. no later than January 15 each year, set a fixed schedule of a minimum of three (3) Management Commission meetings for the Spring, which all members shall make a priority in attending.
- Recommendation 53, which was accepted by the Commission at its March 15, 2017 meeting (CM 2017-034 refers), states the following:

No member shall be permitted to be absent from any Management Commission meeting without good cause and prior approval of the Speaker.

- It has been a consistent practice in recent years for Management Commission meetings to be scheduled on Wednesday, as that day of the week seems to accommodate the schedules of Members of all caucuses.
- When the House is not in Session, meetings have typically been scheduled in the morning (9:00 or 9:30 am). When the House is in Session, they have typically been scheduled when the House adjourns for the day (5:15 or 5:30 pm).

- The Speaker is proposing the following schedule for Winter/Spring 2018 (note in accordance with the Parliamentary Calendar, the House is scheduled to reconvene for the Spring sitting on Monday, February 26):
 - January 17, 2018
 - March 14, 2018
 - April 18, 2018
- The Speaker is requesting that Commission members review the proposed schedule and provide alternate dates should there be any conflicts.
