## Monday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2005

The House met at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to adjournment.

The Member for St. John's North (Mr. Ridgley) made a Statement to inform the House about the Holocaust Memorial Service held at Prince of Wales Collegiate on April 17<sup>th</sup>.

The Member for Terra Nova (Mr. Oram) made a Statement to congratulate students from his District who participated in a Department of Fisheries and Oceans logo contest.
