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#### User's Guide

#### Purpose:

This index is designed to provide easy access to the contents of the Hansard (Debates and Proceedings) of the Seventh Session of the Thirtieth General Assembly of Newfoundland and Labrador (1956).

#### How to search:

The index is divided into two sections: Subject and Speaker.

The Subject section points the reader to various subject matters and parliamentary procedures. It is cross-referenced to assist the reader to successfully locate information. The subject entries are listed alphabetically.

The Speaker section of the index allows the reader to search by the name of the person speaking. Each main heading is further broken down alphabetically by subject matter.

#### Finding the text:

The numbers following the entries in the index refer to page numbers in the 2 bound volumes of Hansard (1956). Volume 1 includes pages [1]-837. Volume 2, which includes the Journal, includes pages 837-1214.

#### Bills

Matters pertaining to legislation are listed chronologically under the title of a bill. When the House of Assembly is prorogued, business is terminated. Any bills that did not go through all stages therefore appear incomplete in the index listing. If a bill listing in the index appears to be missing a component, this indicates that the particular stage of the bill was not referred to in Hansard.

If a particular stage of bill was not recorded in Hansard, but was recorded in the Journal, the index will indicate that with the phrase: (*Note: Recorded in Journal, not in Hansard*), followed by the Journal page number, which is bound together with v. 2 of Hanard.

### Questions

In instances in the index where the Notice of Question is not listed, none was provided in the text of Hansard. Instead of directing the reader to a page number, the index will indicate that the item was not recorded in Hansard.
