

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent under the Great Seal of the said Colony.



# Legislative Council of Newfoundland.

First Session of the Tweiny-First General Assembly.

TUESDAY, MARCH 30th, 1909.

This being the day appointed by Proclamafion for the meeting of the Legislature—

At a Quarter to Three o'clock P. M., the House met.

PRESENT:

At Three o'clock P.M., His Excellency the Governor, Sir William MacGregor, G.C.M.G., G.B., M.D., having arrived at the Council Chamber

and being seated on the Throne, commanded the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, through the Honourable the President of the Legislative Council, to let the Commons House of Assembly know:

His Excellency was pleased to speak as follows:—

Mr. President and Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council:

Gentlemen of the Honourable House of Assembly:

I have deemed it expedient that the first Session of the Twenty-First General Assembly should be opened for the despatch of business on this day, of which I have given notice in my Proclamation, dated the sixteenth day of the present month.

#### Gentlemen of the Honourable House of Assembly:

It is not convenient that I should declare the reasons of calling this General Assembly to-day, and it being necessary that a Speaker of the House of Assembly should be first chosen from amongst your Body; therefore it is my pleasure that you Gentlemen of the House of Assembly do now repair to the place where you are to sit and there proceed to the choice of some proper person to be your Speaker, and present such person whom you





shall so choose, here to-morrow at three o'clock of the afternoon for my approval.

The House of Assembly withdrew.

His Excellency was pleased to retire.

On motion made the House adjourned until tomorrow, Wednesday, at half-past Two o'clock P.M.

Mr. President and Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council:


Gentlemen of the Honourable House of Assembly:
