## AND

# The Election of the Speaker of the House of Assembly

Begun and holden at St. John's in the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador on Monday, the Tenth Day of June, Two Thousand and Nineteen, being the Sixty-Eighth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Our Sovereign Lady Elizabeth the Second by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom, Canada, and Her Other Realms and Territories, QUEEN, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith.

In accordance with the **Elections Act, 1991**, a General Election was held on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2019 after which Her Honour, the Honourable Judy M. Foote, PC, ONL, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador issued the following Proclamation:

### **A PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS** under section 128 of the *Constitution Act, 1867*, I, as Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, am authorized to administer the Oaths or Affirmations of Allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II to those persons elected to be Members of the House of Assembly in the General Election held on May 16<sup>th</sup>, 2019;

**AND WHEREAS** under section 5 of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act*, I, as Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, am authorized to administer an Oath or Affirmation of Office to those persons elected to be Members of the House of Assembly in the said General Election;

**AND WHEREAS** the said sections of the Constitution Act, 1867 and the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act* further require that the persons declared elected as Members during the General Election held on the said date must take their Oaths or Affirmations of Allegiance and Oaths or Affirmations of Office before they can take their seats in the House of Assembly;

**NOW THEREFORE** I, the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, do authorize and direct you, the said Sandra Barnes and Elizabeth Murphy, or either of you, to request that the Members Elect gather in the House of Assembly Chamber on Monday, June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 10:00 o'clock in the morning in order to take their Oaths or Affirmations of Allegiance and Oaths or Affirmations of Office before me.

WITNESS: Our trusty and well-beloved the Honourable Judy M. Foote, Member of the Order of Canada, Chancellor of the Order of Newfoundland and Labrador, Lieutenant Governor in and for Our Province of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Whereupon Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor left the Chamber.

The Clerk informed the Members that at the close of nominations for the Office of Speaker at 4:30 o'clock on June 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019 one candidate had put his name forward, Mr. Perry Trimper. Accordingly pursuant to suborder 4(4) of the Standing Orders, Mr. Perry Trimper, the Member for Lake Melville was acclaimed Speaker of the Forthy-Ninth General Assembly.

Mr. Trimper was conducted to the Speaker's Chair by the Honourable the Premier (Mr. Ball) and the Leader of the Official Opposition (Mr. Crosbie).

Whereupon, the Honourable the Speaker having seated himself in the Speaker's Chair addressed the House, expressing his gratitude to the Honourable Members for the high honour they had unanimously accorded him by electing him Speaker of the House of Assembly.

On motion of the Honourable the Premier (Mr. Ball), seconded by the Leader of the Official Opposition (Mr. Crosbie), the Member for St. George's – Humber (Mr. Reid) was elected Deputy Speaker of the House.

On motion of the Honourable the Premier (Mr. Ball), seconded by the Leader of the Official Opposition (Mr. Crosbie), the Member for Mount Pearl - Southlands (Mr. Lane) was elected Deputy Chair of Committees.

At 1:45 o'clock in the afternoon the Sergeant-at-Arms notified the Honourable the Speaker (Mr. Trimper) that Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor, the Honourable Judy M. Foote, PC, ONL had arrived.

Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor entered the Assembly Chamber preceded by the Sergeant-At-Arms.

The Speaker left the Chair, whereupon the Lieutenant Governor having taken her seat, the Honourable the Premier (Mr. Ball) addressed Her Honour as follows:

"May it please Your Honour:

The House of Assembly, agreeable to Your Honour's Command, have proceeded to the choice of a Speaker, and have elected Perry Trimper, Esquire, Member for the District of Lake Melville, to that office, and by their direction, I present him for Your Honour's approval."

Her Honour was then pleased to reply:

"On behalf of Her Majesty, I assure you of my sense of your efficiency and I do most fully approve and confirm you as the Speaker."

Whereupon the Speaker addressed Her Honour as follows:

"Your Honour having approved the choice of this House in constituting me as its Speaker, it now becomes my duty in the name of the representatives of Her Majesty's loyal subjects, the people of this Province, respectfully to claim of Your Honour their accustomed rights and privileges, especially that they shall have freedom of speech in their debates, that they may be free from arrest during their attendance in Parliament and that I, as Speaker, may have full access to Your Honour's presence at all reasonable times, and that they have confirmed to them all their ancient rights and privileges which have been confirmed to them by Your Honour's Predecessors."

Her Honour was then pleased to reply:

"On behalf of Her Majesty, I do confirm this House in the enjoyment of all their ancient and undoubted rights and privileges."

Her Honour was then pleased to open the Session with a Speech From the Throne.

Her Honour then left the Assembly Chamber.

The Speaker resumed the Chair.

On motion of the Honourable the Government House Leader (Mr. Parsons) and by leave of the House, a Bill entitled, "An Act To Amend The Revenue Administration Act" No. 1) was introduced and read the first time.

On motion it was ordered that Bill No. 1 be read the second time on tomorrow.

The Speaker announced that Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor had been pleased to make a Speech to the Members of the House of Assembly and directed the Pages to distribute copies to all Members.

It was moved by the Member for Fortune Bay – Cape La Hune (Mr. Loveless), seconded by the Member for Mount Scio (Ms. Stoodley), that an Address of Thanks be presented to Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor in reply to the Gracious Speech with which she had been pleased to open the present Session of the Legislature, and that a Select Committee be appointed to draft the Address In Reply.

The Leader of the Opposition (Mr. Crosbie), the Leader of the Third Party (Ms. Coffin) and the Honourable the Premier (Mr. Ball) also spoke to the motion.

The motion was adopted by the House and it was ordered accordingly that the following Members be appointed to the Select Committee to draft the Address in Reply:

The Member for Windsor Lake (Mr. Crosbie) gave notice that he would on tomorrow ask leave to introduce the following Resolution:

"BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Standing Orders Committee be directed to undertake a scan of Question Period rules and procedures in various jurisdictions and bring forward for consideration during the fall sitting of 2019 a recommendation to amend the Standing Orders of the House respecting Oral Questions to require Ministers to answer questions in a manner which is brief and to the point and relevant and responsive to the question."

The Opposition House Leader (Mr. Brazil) announced, pursuant to Standing Order 63(3), that the Resolution of which the Member for Windsor Lake (Mr. Crosbie) had given notice would be debated on Private Members' Day, Wednesday, June 12<sup>th</sup>.

The Honourable the Minister of Finance and President of Treasury Board (Mr. Osborne) gave notice that he would on tomorrow ask leave to introduce a Bill entitled "An Act To Authorize The Raising Of Money By Way Of Loan By The Province" (Bill No. 3).

The Honourable the Minister of Finance and President of Treasury Board (Mr. Osborne) gave notice that he would on tomorrow move that the House resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole on Supply to Consider Certain Resolutions for the Granting of Supply to Her Majesty" (Bill No. 4).
