Administration of the Oath or Affirmation of Office to Members-elect

AND

The Election of the Speaker of the House of Assembly

Begun and holden at St. John's in the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador on Monday, the Twelfth Day of April, Two Thousand and Twenty-One, being the Seventieth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Our Sovereign Lady Elizabeth the Second by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom, Canada, and Her Other Realms and Territories, QUEEN, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith.

In accordance with the <u>Elections Act, 1991</u>, the General Election of February 13, 2021 was held, after which Her Honour, the Honourable Judy M. Foote, PC, ONL, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador issued the following Proclamation:

GREETING:

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS under section 128 of the <u>Constitution Act, 1867</u>, I, as Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, am authorized to administer the Oaths or Affirmations of Allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II to those persons elected to be Members of the House of Assembly in the General Election held on February 13th, 2021:

AND WHEREAS under section 5 of the <u>House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act</u>, I, as Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, am authorized to administer an Oath or Affirmation of Office to those persons elected to be Members of the House of Assembly in the said General Election;

AND WHEREAS the said sections of the Constitution Act, 1867 and the <u>House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act</u> further require that the persons declared elected as Members during the General Election held on the said date must take their Oaths or Affirmations of Allegiance and Oaths or Affirmations of Office before they can take their seats in the House of Assembly;

NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, do authorize and direct you, the said Sandra Barnes and Kim Hawley George, or either of you, to request that the Members Elect gather in the House of Assembly Chamber on Monday, April 12th, 2021 at 10:00 o'clock in the morning in order to take their Oaths or Affirmations of Allegiance and Oaths or Affirmations of Office before me.

ELECTION OF THE SPEAKER

The House met at 3 p.m.

The Sergeant-at-Arms announced the arrival of the Lieutenant Governor.

The Lieutenant Governor entered the Chamber and took the Chair.

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS a General Election of the Members of the General Assembly of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador was held on February 13th, 2021;

AND WHEREAS the Office of the Speaker of the House of Assembly is vacant and it is expedient to call together the Fiftieth General Assembly for the Members of the House of Assembly to proceed to elect their choice of Speaker;

NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, do authorize and direct you, the said Sandra Barnes and Kim Hawley George, or either of you, to signify to the Members of the said House of Assembly to assemble for the dispatch of business on Monday, April 12th, 2021 at 3:00 o'clock in the afternoon and that it is my pleasure that they should proceed to choose some person to be their Speaker and to present such person for my approbation.

WITNESS: Our trusty and well-beloved the Honourable Judy M. Foote, Member of Our Privy Council of Canada, Chancellor of the Order of Newfoundland and Labrador, Lieutenant Governor in and for Our Province of Newfoundland and Labrador.

The Lieutenant Governor left the Chamber.

The Clerk informed the Members that at the close of nominations for the Office of Speaker at 4:30 p.m., Friday, April 9, 2021, the following candidates had put their name forward:

The House proceeded to the election of the Speaker, pursuant to Standing Order 2.

Once the voting was completed, the Clerks-at-the-Table withdrew to count the ballots.

The Clerk returned, announced that no one candidate had received a majority of votes and advised that, pursuant to Standing Order 4(14), the following were the remaining candidates:

MHA Derek Bennett MHA Paul Dinn MHA Scott Reid MHA Brian Warr

The House proceeded to a second ballot for the election of Speaker, pursuant to Standing Order 4(15).

Once the voting was completed, the Clerks-at-the-Table withdrew to count the ballots.

The Clerk returned and announced that, pursuant to Standing Order 4(11), the Member for the District of Lewisporte - Twillingate, Derek Bennett had been elected as Speaker.

D. Bennett was escorted to the Speaker's Chair by the Leader of the Government in the House (A. Furey) and the Leader of the Official Opposition (D. Brazil).

The Speaker assumed the Chair and addressed the House.

On behalf of the Members of the House of Assembly, the Speaker offered condolences to Her Majesty The Queen and the Royal Family on the passing of His Royal Highness, The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh.

APPROBATION

The Sergeant-at-Arms announced the arrival of the Lieutenant Governor.

The Lieutenant Governor took the Chair.

The Leader of the Government in the House (A. Furey) addressed the Lieutenant Governor as follows:

"May it please Your Honour:

The House of Assembly, agreeable to Your Honour's Command, have proceeded to the choice of a Speaker, and have elected Derek Bennett, Member for the District of Lewisporte - Twillingate, to that office, and by their direction, I present them for Your Honour's approval."

The Lieutenant Governor replied:

"On behalf of Her Majesty, I assure you of my sense of your efficiency and I do most fully approve and confirm you as the Speaker."

The Speaker (D. Bennett) addressed the Lieutenant Governor as follows:

"Your Honour having approved the choice of this House in constituting me as its Speaker, it now becomes my duty in the name of the representatives of Her Majesty's loyal subjects, the people of this Province, respectfully to claim of Your Honour their accustomed rights and privileges, especially that they shall have freedom of speech in their debates, that they may be free from arrest during their attendance in Parliament and that I, as Speaker, may have full access to Your Honour's presence at all reasonable times, and that they have confirmed to them all their ancient rights and privileges which have been confirmed to them by Your Honour's Predecessors."

The Lieutenant Governor replied:

"On behalf of Her Majesty, I do confirm this House in the enjoyment of all their ancient and undoubted rights and privileges."

The Lieutenant Governor left the Chamber.

The Speaker (D. Bennett) resumed the Chair.

The Government House Leader (S. Crocker) advised the House that the motion to appoint a Deputy Speaker would be made at a later date.

It was moved and seconded that when the House rose it would adjourn until Thursday, April 15 at 10 a.m. for the Speech from the Throne.

The Speaker (D. Bennett) put the question and, on motion, the House adjourned accordingly.
