MOTIONS

Government Motions

1. Minister of Finance and President of Treasury Board – To move:

THAT this House approve in general the budgetary policy of the Government (Budget Motion) (*adjourned*).

2. Minister of Finance and President of Treasury Board – To move:

THAT this House resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole on Supply to consider certain resolutions for the Granting of Supply to His Majesty and related bill (Bill 107).

3. Minister of Finance and President of Treasury Board – To move:

THAT this House resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole on Ways and Means to consider a resolution relating to the raising of loans by the Province and related bill (Bill 110).

4. Government House Leader – To move:

Be it resolved by the House of Assembly as follows:

WHEREAS subsection 3(2) of the *Citizens' Representative Act* provides that the Citizens' Representative is to be appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council on a resolution of the House of Assembly;

AND WHEREAS section 5 of the Act states that a commissioner may be reappointed;

AND WHEREAS the appointment of the current commissioner, Bradley Moss expires on April 30;

AND WHEREAS it is proposed that Bradley Moss be reappointed as the commissioner for a term of 6 years;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Bradley Moss be appointed as the Citizens' Representative for a term of 6 years.

5. Government House Leader – To move:

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Assembly as follows:

WHEREAS section 7 of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act* provides that, upon nomination by the House of Assembly, the Clerk of the House of Assembly shall be appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council by Commission under the Great Seal;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Kim Hawley George, KC be nominated for immediate appointment as Clerk of the House of Assembly.

Private Members' Motions

6. Member for Labrador West – To move:

WHEREAS Labrador is an integral part of this province;

WHEREAS geography dictates that Labradorians must rely on air travel for many non-tourism reasons such as education, bereavement leave, visiting sick loved ones, or medical treatments not covered under MTAP;

WHEREAS the cost of travel to and from Labrador is prohibitively expensive;

WHEREAS the cost of living in Labrador is already far higher than the rest of the province and these extra travel fees create an added burden on people's household budgets;

WHEREAS the differential in travel costs for people on the island and in Labrador puts the latter at a disadvantage; and

WHEREAS Labrador is a strong economic driver of this province and justice therefore demands that Labradorians should not experience any added economic hardship solely on the basis of geography;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this honourable House calls on the government to work with Indigenous partners, businesses, and the federal government to implement a plan that reduces costs and increases the accessibility of air travel to, from, and within Labrador.
