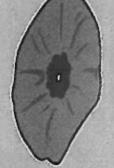

Title: Categorization under *Transparency and Accountability Act*

Issue: Approval of categorization for the Office of the Seniors' Advocate

Background:

- Section 48 of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act* applies the planning and reporting requirements of the *Transparency and Accountability Act* (the Act) to the offices of the Legislature (i.e. House of Assembly Service and the Statutory Offices).
- The Act requires government entities to table plans in the House of Assembly every three years and to report annually on their progress. The type of plan required for an entity depends on their categorization, which is determined through an assessment of the entity based on specific criteria.
- The three categories as established under the Act are:
 - o Category 1 requiring a strategic plan
 - o Category 2 requiring a business plan
 - o Category 3 requiring an activity plan
- The Lieutenant-Governor in Council approves the categorization of government entities, except for the entities of the Legislature which are approved by the Management Commission.
- Categorization assessments have been approved previously for the House of Assembly Service and Statutory Offices. Due to the recent establishment of the Office of the Seniors' Advocate in November 2017, the approval of their categorization is required at this time so that the office can begin necessary planning to fulfill the requirements of the Act.
- The Seniors' Advocate has completed the categorization assessment form which recommends the office be approved as a Category 3 entity (see Attachment 1).

<u>Title:</u> Constituency Office Security

Issue: Approval of funds for the installation of video security intercom with door release

in constituency offices

Background:

• An employee risk assessment, as required under the *Occupational Health and Safety Act*, was conducted for each of the twenty three constituency offices outside Confederation Building Complex (in leased space or government-owned buildings that do not have security measures presently in place).

- The assessment indicated a specific security risk of the constituency assistants who
 frequently work alone in these spaces. In many of these locations, persons entering the
 premises cannot be identified until they occupy the office space. Additionally, there have
 been several reported incidents of threatening behavior of visitors to these offices towards the
 constituency assistants.
- The employer has a duty under the Occupational Health and Safety Regulations to minimize the risk to workers where elimination of a risk to workers is not possible. While constituency assistants are hired by the MHA, their employment contracts and the office leases are executed by the Speaker on behalf of the Legislature.
- The House of Assembly Service proposes that one mechanism to manage the security risk is to equip these offices with a video security intercom.
- Each office will need to be quoted individually, but based on seven quotes received to date it is anticipated that the cost per office will be approximately \$3,000 each, for a total estimated cost of \$69,000 (23 offices x \$3,000). As new leases are tendered, the requirement for such security features will be incorporated into the tender requirements.
- The Management Commission's approval is required for the expenditure of funds to cover the costs associated with the installation of the equipment in each of the current constituency offices. The funds would come from the Members' Allowances & Assistance Operational Resources.

Briefing Note

<u>Title:</u> Alternate Members for Management Commission Meetings

Issue: Request from the Member for Mount Pearl-Southlands to allow for alternates at meetings of the Management Commission

Background:

- The Member for Mount Pearl-Southlands recently requested that the Speaker give consideration to assigning alternates for meetings of the Management Commission in an effort to better ensure attendance of representatives from all parties (see Attachment 1).#
- The MHA's request followed recent amendments to subsection 18(8) of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act* (the Act) that changed the requirements for achieving a quorum for meetings of the Commission to a simple majority, including the Speaker. #
- The change resulted from a recommendation of the 2016 Members' Compensation Review Committee (MCRC) which was accepted by the Commission. Previously, a quorum had to include 50% of its members, with at least one member from the government caucus, at least one member from an opposition caucus, as well as the Speaker or Deputy Speaker. #
- Section 18 of the Act specifically provides alternates for two members of the Commission as follows:
 - 1. The Speaker:
 - 18 (8) A quorum of the commission is a majority of its members, one of whom shall be the speaker or the deputy speaker.
 - 2. The Clerk (who is a non-voting member and not included in the quorum):
 - 18 (10) In the absence of the clerk, the clerk assistant shall be the secretary to the commission.
- As the Act clearly contemplates alternates for some positions but not others, it can be
 inferred that alternates are not permissible in accordance with the principle of implied
 exclusion.
- In statutory interpretation, the principle of implied exclusion (*expressio unius est exclusio alterus*) is explained as follows:

"if a statute specifies one exception (or more) to a general rule, other exceptions are not to be read in. The rationale is that the legislator has turned its mind to the issue and provided for the exemptions which were intended."

- An implied exclusion argument lies whenever there is reason to believe that if the legislature had meant to include a particular item within its legislation, it would have referred to that item expressly.
- Therefore, based on this principle of statutory interpretation, an amendment to the Act would be required to allow for alternates on the Management Commission. This amendment would have to take into account the structure of the Commission as outlined in Section 18 which requires three Members representing government and three Members representing the opposition, one of whom must be from the Third Party should it be represented in the Legislature.
- Section 18 also stipulates that a member of the Commission cannot serve concurrently on the Public Accounts Committee unless there are insufficient Members in in the House of Assembly in opposition to government to allow for this.
- In General Assemblies where Government holds a significant majority (e.g. following the 2007 general election when Government held 44 seats, the Official Opposition held 3 seats and the Third Party 1 seat), alternates for opposition members would not be possible.
- The Commission has a primary function to ensure the effective and transparent financial and administrative operations of the Legislative branch, and individual members have very specific fiduciary responsibilities as outlined in Section 21 of the Act.
- Due to these statutory responsibilities of individual members, subsection 22(1) of the Act requires that the Speaker, assisted by the Clerk, ensure that appropriate orientation and training programs are delivered to members of the Management Commission. Allowing alternates could potentially dilute these fiduciary responsibilities, which in turn would reduce accountability.
- Policy provisions of the Commission do provide a number of mechanisms to ensure maximum participation of Commission members, specifically:
 - o requirement to schedule meetings of the Commission;
 - o participation in meetings of up to two Commission members by telephone;
 - o ability of a Commission member to submit written commentary;
 - o the ability of a Commission member to request deferral of items; and
 - o restriction on scheduling Commission meetings that conflict with Cabinet meetings.

Legislative Impact:

Section 18 of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act* establishes the structure of the Management Commission and outlines its membership. In that provision, alternates to statutorily appointed persons are contemplated for the Speaker and the Clerk only (subsections 18(8) and (10) respectively refer), suggesting that the intention behind these provisions is to ensure administrative continuity and accountability.

An amendment to Section 18 of the Act would be required to allow alternates.

Options:

- 1. Continue with the current provisions of the *House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act*, prohibiting alternate members for meetings of the Management Commission.
- 2. Direct that amendments to the House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity and Administration Act be drafted to permit alternate members for meetings of the Management Commission.

Status:

I am writing you in your capacity of Chair of the House of Assembly Management Commission relating to the recently passed Bill 19: An Act to Amend the House of Assembly Accountability, Integrity & Administration Act No. 3. As you are aware, the amendments contained within this Bill stem from recommendations of the MCRC and included an amendment to change the quorum of the commission to a majority of its members, one of whom shall be the speaker or deputy speaker. Of course the previous legislation defined a quorum as requiring the attendance of members of the opposition.

As you know, while this provision had been supported at the HOA Management Commission by all parties, upon its debate in the HOA, Members (including myself who is not a member of the Commission) expressed concerns regarding this change. I'm therefore suggesting as a compromise that maintains this change while at the same time better ensuring attendance of representatives from all parties at Management Commission meetings, that you give consideration to assigning alternates from each party.
