Fork over six billion dollars or else the lights will go off. That seems to be the message that it sends. That's the kind of language that blackmailers use. It has to do with closing down the Holyrood thermal generating station. While it is true that this facility is past its best before date, one of the many reasons for substituting Muskrat Falls is that Holyrood is producing too much carbon dioxide -supposed to be a dangerous polluting substance.
