OVERVIEW

The Newfoundland and Labrador Award for Bravery is one of the elements of the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador's honours system. It was established via the *Bravery Award Act* for the purpose of recognizing citizens of the province whose life and safety have been risked while giving assistance to another person.

Any resident of Newfoundland and Labrador is eligible to be nominated for a Bravery Award. Incidents for which persons have been nominated for the Bravery Award include, as examples, rendering assistance to an individual in danger of drowning or perishing in a fire.

The Newfoundland and Labrador Bravery Award Review Panel is appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council¹ as per section 4.(1) of the *Bravery Award Act*. Current membership comprises:

- The Royal Newfoundland Constabulary's Chief of Police;
- The Assistant Commissioner, B Division, Royal Canadian Mounted Police,
- The Fire Commissioner.

The Deputy Clerk of the Executive Council is the secretary to the Review Panel. The Review Panel meets as required.

MANDATE

The Review Panel receives its mandate from section 4 of the *Bravery Award Act*. Specifically, it is mandated to:

- accept and consider nominations of persons eligible for the Bravery Award; and
- recommend to the Lieutenant Governor in Council the names of those persons who are eligible to receive the Bravery Award.

OBJECTIVE

As the focus of the Newfoundland and Labrador Bravery Award Review Panel will remain consistent, the objective and indicators will not change over the period covered by this plan and the Panel will report progress annually.

By March 31, 2018, the Newfoundland and Labrador Bravery Award Review Panel, where appropriate, will have made recommendations to the Lieutenant Governor in Council regarding recipients of the Newfoundland and Labrador Award for Bravery.
