## Overview

The Newfoundland and Labrador Bravery Award is an important component of the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador's honours system. It was formed through the **Bravery Award Act** for the purpose of recognizing citizens of the province whose life and safety have been risked while giving assistance to another person.

Any resident of Newfoundland and Labrador is eligible to be nominated for a Bravery Award. Incidents for which individuals have been nominated for the Bravery Award include, as examples, rendering assistance to an individual in danger of drowning or perishing in a fire.

The Newfoundland and Labrador Bravery Award Review Panel is appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council as per subsection 4(1) of the **Bravery Award Act**. Membership is as follows:

- the Chief of Police, Royal Newfoundland Constabulary,
- the Assistant Commissioner, Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and
- the Fire Commissioner.

The Deputy Clerk of the Executive Council serves as Secretary to the Review Panel. The Review Panel convenes as necessary to fulfill its mandate, which involves evaluating nominations of individuals eligible for the Bravery Award and submitting recommendations to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

## Report on Performance

As the Newfoundland and Labrador Bravery Award Review Panel has a narrow and consistent mandate year over year, it reports on the same objective and indicators for each year of the planning period.

Section 3 of the **Bravery Award Act** states:

“The government of the province may present an award to a citizen of the

province whose life and safety have been risked while giving assistance to another person.”

Pursuant to the **Bravery Award Act**, the presentation of the Bravery Award is determined by the documented acts of bravery and the nominations submitted for consideration.

**Objective**

By March 31, 2025, the Newfoundland and Labrador Bravery Award Review Panel, where appropriate, will have made recommendations to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council regarding recipients of the Newfoundland and Labrador Bravery Award.
