MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

The Second Session of 40th General Assembly of this Honourable House Assembly is about to Before relieving you prorogued. from your duties, I wish to convey to you my appreciation for the careful and sympathetic attention given to the important matters brought before you by my Ministers.

SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

Forty-nine pieces of legislation were enacted during this Session of Honourable House the Assembly. In particular, legislative initiatives were taken in the administration of justice, municipal affairs, consumer affairs, finance and the offshore our development of resources.

In the area of the administration several significant justice, legislative measures enacted. For the first time since 1889, a new Judicature Act was passed. This Act revised the law relating to the superior courts of The Act abolished the Province. the District Court of Newfoundland and merged its functions with the Trial Division of the Supreme It is my Government's hope Court. that the services of the Supreme Court will now be brought closer to people in the rural areas of our Province. The new Judicature Act also provided new Rules of Court which reformed much of the civil procedure used in Our Supreme Court since the 1880's when the Colony of Newfoundland adopted the original English Rules of Court.

In keeping with the reform and change in philosophy of company law throughout North America, my Government introduced an Act revise and reform the law respecting corporations. The old Companies Act had its origins in English Century Statutes, which the Colony of Newfoundland used as a basis for its Act of 1899. years, Over the original Newfoundland law had been amended but with no real change in basic philosophy. Again, it is my Government's hope that the new Corporations Act will assist in the development of our Province.

My Government introduced International Commercial Arbitration Act to provide for the application in this Province of the Convention on the Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Arbitration Awards adopted by the United Nations.

insurance adjusters, agents and brokers was enacted during this Session. As well, an amendment was introduced to The Real Estate trading Act to provide for the establishment of a real estate Foundation.

In the area of labour, my Government introduced very significant legislation respecting standards and workers' compensation. With respect my Government standards, labour introduced amendments to Labour Standards Act, 1977 to provide that an employee entitled to receive a period of seventeen weeks of adoption leave to provide that tips gratuities are the property of the employee to whom or for whom they are given. Further, my Government introduced amendments ta Workers' Compensation Act, 1983 to provide that the activities of the Commission are overseen by a Board of Directors and to establish the Workers' Compensation Appeal Tribunal.

As a further indication of mν Government's commitment to future of our young people, my Government introduced an Act provide for payment of financial assistance for students attending post-secondary educational institutions. My Government also introduced amendments to The Marine Institute Act and The Memorial University Act.

In the area of municipal affairs, my Government introduced legislation to revise and consolidate the law respecting the assessment of real property for the purposes of the imposition of property taxes by municipalities and school tax authorities.

During this Session, my Government introduced a number of amendments certain financial measures. Throughout its office. Government has been very sensitive to the needs of persons on fixed incomes, particularly those whose main source of income is pension. Consequently, pensions to former public servants were increased further during this In this Session. regard, Government also introduced amendments to The Portability of Pensions Act and The Public Service (Pensions) Legislation was also introduced to amend the Income Tax Act maintain uniformity federal and provincial law.

mindful of our fragile environment, Government my introduced legislation to amend The Department of Environment Act to provide that a person responsible for the occurrence of pollution is liable for the cost up the pollution. cleaning Also the fines for a violation of the Act were substantially increased.

During this Session, my Government introduced further amendments to The Leaseholds in St. John's Act to facilitate the obtaining of the freehold to property by a lessee entitled to the freehold.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

As Honourable Members will recall, on February 11, 1985, Government and the Government of signed the Atlantic Accord. During this Session, my Government introduced a Bill that implements this Memorandum Agreement between both Governments on offshore petroleum resource management and revenue sharing. As well, my Government introduced amendments to The Petroleum and Natural Gas Act to provide for the establishment of a royalty system by the Government of the Province in accordance with the terms of the Atlantic Accord.
