Begun and holden at St. John's in the Province of Newfoundland on Monday, the twenty-eighth day of February, One Thousand, Nine Hundred and Ninety-Four, being the Forty-third year of the Reign of Her Majesty Our Sovereign Lady Elizabeth the Second by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom, Canada, and Her Other Realms and Territories, QUEEN, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, the Honourable Frederick W. Russell, having fixed the hour at which he proposed to open the present Session of the Legislature at 2 o'clock in the afternoon of the 28th day of February, 1994, the Members of the House of Assembly met in the Assembly Chamber at 2 o'clock in the afternoon when Mr. Speaker Dicks took the Chair.

Monday, February 28, 1994

At 2 o'clock in the afternoon the Sergeant-at-Arms notified the Speaker that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor, the Honourable Frederick W. Russell, had arrived.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor entered the Assembly Chamber preceded by the Sergeant-at-Arms.

The Speaker left the Chair.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor took the Chair.

His Honour was then pleased to open the Session with a Speech From the Throne.

His Honour then left the Assembly Chamber.

The Speaker resumed the Chair.

On motion of the Honourable the Government House Leader (Mr. Roberts) and by leave of the House, a Bill entitled, "An Act To Regulate The Electrical Power Resources Of Newfoundland And Labrador" (Bill No. 2) was introduced and read a first time.

On motion it was ordered that Bill No. 2 be read a second time on tomorrow.

The Speaker announced that His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor had been pleased to make a Speech to the Members met in the General Assembly and that for greater accuracy he had obtained a copy.

It was unanimously agreed that the Speech should be taken as read and copies distributed to Members.

It was moved by the Member for Torngat Mountains (Mr. Andersen) and seconded by the Member for St. John's North (Mr. Lloyd Matthews) that an Address of Thanks be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor in reply to the Gracious Speech with which he had been pleased to open the present Session of the Legislature, and that a Select Committee be appointed to draft the Address In Reply.

The Leader of the Opposition (Mr. Simms) and the Honourable the Premier (Mr. Wells) spoke to the motion.

The motion was adopted by the House and it was ordered accordingly that the following Members be appointed to the Select Committee:

The Honourable the Premier (Mr. Wells) gave notice that he would on tomorrow ask leave to introduce a Bill entitled, "An Act Respecting The Privatization Of The Newfoundland And Labrador Hydro-Electric Corporation" (Bill No. 1).

The Member for Kilbride (Mr. Edward Byrne) gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

"WHEREAS the federal budget will have a major negative impact on personal incomes and provincial government revenues;


AND WHEREAS the loss of income from unemployment insurance and fisheries compensation will reduce business activity and employment everywhere in the province and further weaken the already frail provincial economy;

AND WHEREAS the federal government has unfairly singled out Newfoundland to bear a disproportionate share of federal spending cuts;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Honourable House condemn the changes to unemployment insurance and reduced funding for fisheries compensation that unfairly penalize the people and economy of Newfoundland and Labrador."

It was ordered that when the House rose it would adjourn until tomorrow, Tuesday, March 1st at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

On motion the House then adjourned accordingly.

Tuesday, March 1st, 1994

The House met at 2 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to adjournment.

On motion this Report was received and on motion and by leave of the House the Debate on the Address in Reply was deferred until after routine proceedings.

The Honourable the Minister of Industry, Trade and Technology (Mr. Furey) tabled the Annual Report and financial statements of Enterprise Newfoundland and Labrador Corporation for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1993.

The Honourable the Minister of Justice (Mr. Roberts) gave notice that he would on tomorrow ask leave to introduce a Bill entitled, "An Act To Amend The Automobile Insurance Act" (Bill No. 8).

The Member for LaPoile (Mr. Ramsay) presented a Petition on behalf of residents of the Town of Rose Blanche imploring the Government to entertain proposals from community leaders with respect to the revitalization of the fishing industry in that town.

Pursuant to order and on motion the Bill entitled, "An Act Respecting The Privatization Of The Newfoundland And Labrador Hydro-Electric Corporation" (Bill No. 1) was introduced and read a first time and on motion it was ordered that the said Bill be read a second time on tomorrow.

Pursuant to order and on motion debate on the Address in Reply was commenced by the Member for Grand Bank (Mr. W. Matthews) who moved, seconded by the Member for Humber Valley (Mr. Woodford), the following amendment:

That all the words after 'that' be deleted in the motion before the House, and the following words substituted therefor:

"This House deplores the Government's failure to deal adequately with the real problems of unemployment facing our people, and its failure to provide competent management of our Province."


The Speaker ruled the amendment in order.

Wednesday, March 2nd, 1994

The House met at 2 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to adjournment.

The Honourable the Minister of Industry, Trade and Technology (Mr. Furey) made a statement to announce that the management of the financial affairs of the Community of Sheshatshit had been placed in trusteeship.

By leave of the House, the Leader of the Opposition (Mr. Simms), seconded by the Honourable the Premier (Mr. Wells) and the Member for St. John's East (Mr. Harris) moved that letters of condolence be sent by the House to the families of the late Gordon Lidstone and Enos Darby.

The Honourable the Minister of Health (Dr. Kitchen) tabled the Annual Report of the Newfoundland Medical Care Commission for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1993.

The Member for St. John's North (Mr. Lloyd Matthews) gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

"WHEREAS the Strategic Economic Plan of Newfoundland and Labrador firmly establishes the private sector as being the primary engine of economic growth within the Province;

AND WHEREAS 66% of all new jobs are generated in the area of small family businesses;

AND WHEREAS small family businesses account for 55% of the gross national product;

AND WHEREAS various studies and reports have pointed to small and medium size businesses as one of the potential growth areas of the economy of this Province;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this House of Assembly reaffirms its recognition of small business as a major part of the private sector economy of this Province and reaffirms its commitment to

support organizations that promote the interest of small business,

develop programs to assist small businesses in this Province,

promote the fostering of an economic environment wherein small business development is encouraged,

continue to streamline the regulatory structures and processes of government so as to simplify and enhance the possibility of success of small business enterprises,

encourage the development of entrepreneurship in the Province at the small business level generally."

The Member for Burin - Placentia West (Mr. Tobin) presented a Petition on behalf of residents of his District respecting the damage to automobile windshields allegedly due to the use of coarse sand mixed with salt by the Department of Works, Services and Transportation on the highways of the Burin Peninsula.

Thursday, March 3rd, 1994

"That Bill No. 2, "An Act To Regulate The Electrical Power Resources of Newfoundland And Labrador", be amended by striking out all the words after the word "That" and substituting the following:

"Bill No. 2, "An Act To Regulate The Electrical Power Resources of Newfoundland And Labrador", be not now read a second time but that it be read a second time 6 months from now."

The Speaker ruled the amendment in order.

The amendment was debated during which several Points of Order were raised. The House recessed for 35 minutes.

The Speaker returned to the Chair.

The Speaker ruled that there was an agreement before the House as accepted by the House earlier in the day.



The House recessed for 50 minutes.



Essential employees "22. (1) A retailer and a bargaining agent may jointly establish and file with the public utilities board a written statement of the number of employees in each classification in the unit represented by the bargaining agent who are considered to be essential employees which, upon receipt by the public utilities board, shall be binding upon the retailer, the bargaining agent and the employees as an order of the public utilities board.

(2) If the retailer and the bargaining agent do not jointly file a written statement with the public utilities board under subsection (1), either the retailer or the bargaining agent may make an application to the public utilities board to determine the number of essential employees in each classification and the public utilities board shall make such an order.

(3) Within 15 days of the making of an application under subsection (2), the retailer shall provide the bargaining agent and the public utilities board with a written statement of the number of essential employees in each classification who are considered by the retailer to be essential employees.

(4) The number of employees determined to be essential under subsection (2) shall not exceed the number contained in the written statement provided by the retailer under subsection (3).

(5) The public utilities board may, in its discretion, make an interim order under this section based upon such information as it considers necessary and with or without a hearing or notice, which order shall be effective until the public utilities board makes a final order.

(6) A copy of any application made to the public utilities board by a retailer or by a bargaining agent under this section shall be provided to the other party by the applicant not later than 2 days after the application is received by the public utilities board.

(7) Where a hearing is requested by either the retailer or the bargaining agent arising from an application made under subsection (2) or arising from an interim order made under this section, the public utilities board shall hold a hearing into the matter which hearing shall take place not earlier than 15 days after the application was received by it.

(8) The public utilities board may, at any time, amend an order of joint settlement made under subsection (1) or a determination made under subsection (2), and the provisions of subsections (2) and (7) relating to representation, hearing and interim orders shall apply for an amendment as they apply for a determination.

(9) The number of essential employees determined in an amendment to an order of joint settlement shall not exceed the number contained in the order of joint settlement made under subsection (1) or the number contained in the written statement provided by the retailer under subsection (2) unless the retailer and the bargaining agent consent to a greater number.

(10) A determination or amendment made under this section shall be communicated in writing by the public utilities board to the bargaining agent and the retailer not later than 10 days after the determination or amendment is made.

(11) The retailer shall within 10 days of filing a written statement under subsection (1) or receiving from the public utilities board a determination or an amendment under subsection (2) or (8) name the employees in the unit who are essential, but the number of employees named shall not exceed the number considered to be essential as jointly agreed upon under subsection (1) or determined by the public utilities board to be essential under subsection (2) or (8).

(12) The retailer may substitute the name of an employee who is essential for the name of another employee who is essential but the number of employees named shall not exceed the number considered to be essential as jointly agreed upon under subsection (1) or determined by the public utilities board to be essential under subsection (2) or (8).

(13) The retailer shall notify in writing the bargaining agent and each employee in the bargaining unit named by the retailer as an essential employee that he or she has been named as an essential employee.

(14) An employee named as an essential employee shall report for work as if a strike or lockout were not taking place.

(15) Where an employee named as an essential employee does not report for work as required under subsection (14), the retailer shall immediately terminate the employment of that employee, unless the retailer is satisfied that there are reasonable grounds for the employee not so reporting."

4. That Clause 23 of Bill No. 2 be amended by renumbering the proposed subsections (2) to (7) as subsections (3) to (8) and by adding immediately after subsection (1) the following:

"(2) Where a corporation existing under the laws of the province holds more than 85% of the voting shares of a retailer on April 1, 1994, paragraph (1)(a) shall not apply to that holding."

The Honourable the Speaker tabled the auditor's report and financial statements of the Office of the Auditor General for the financial year ended March 31, 1994.

The Leader of the Opposition (Mr. Simms) gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

"BE IT RESOLVED that this Honourable House expresses its desire for reforms to address the need for better quality, higher achievement and greater efficiency in our school system;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this House requests Government to bring in legislation to enact changes recommended in the 1992 Report of the Royal Commission on Education that can be dealt with entirely within the legislative jurisdiction of this legislature; and further urges Government and denominational representatives to negotiate an agreement for greater co-operation and co-ordination among denominational school systems in the delivery of educational services;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, affirming its desire that the negotiations between Government and denominational representatives proceed in good faith, this House gives its solemn pledge to the holders of the educational rights and privileges protected in the Constitution, that it will not arbitrarily remove or amend those rights and privileges without their consent."

The Honourable the Minister of Finance (Mr. Baker) gave notice that he would on tomorrow ask leave to introduce a Bill entitled, "An Act To Amend The Pensions Funding Act" (Bill No. 35).

AND WHEREAS any such initiative would have a negative impact on the image of this Province and be detrimental to other forms of industrial and economic development, including and especially the development of our tourism and aquaculture industries;

AND WHEREAS the overwhelming majority of the people of Newfoundland and Labrador are opposed in principal to any such initiatives;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Honourable House of Assembly take such action as may be necessary to enact legislation that would effectively prohibit the importation of garbage and/or industrial waste in any quantity or form for final disposal in the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador."

The Member for St. John's Centre (Dr. Kitchen) gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

"**WHEREAS** the issue of fire safety among the residents and owners of property in the older row housing units in St. John's is of prime concern;

AND WHEREAS many of the row houses in this area have inadequate fire blocks between attached houses, in some cases with common attics and no fire blocks at all between houses;

AND WHEREAS there is currently a lack of effort on the part of the provincial, federal and municipal governments to address this problem;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Provincial Government begin immediately to devote more of its financial resources to instituting programs and policies which would assist in the refurbishment of existing units and buildings, both private and publicly owned, in the downtown core of St. John's, and other communities with similar safety problems with row housing."

The Member for LaPoile (Mr. Ramsay) gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

"**WHEREAS**, advances in information technology are revolutionizing business, government, academia and society in general;

WHEREAS the growth of the information technology sector is important to the economic development of this Province;

WHEREAS potentials exist for cost effective access by the public to government information;

BE IT RESOLVED that this House of Assembly recognizes the importance of development in the information technology sector and

- 1.) supports the establishment of local public access computer networks or freenets in this Province;
- 2.) is committed to being an information provider for such networks and to allowing public access to government information in this way, and
- 3.) supports the continuation of the Stem-net and related computer network activities."

The Member for Harbour Main (Mr. Whelan) gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

"WHEREAS there has been worldwide growth in the importance of aquaculture;

AND WHEREAS Newfoundland and Labrador is a Province with extensive coastlines and a history of leading the way in marine related industries;

BE IT RESOLVED that this House of Assembly recognizes the potential of the aquaculture industry in this Province and encourages government to continue its focus on this growth industry."

The Member for Fogo (Mr. Tulk) gave notice that he would on tomorrow move the following Resolution:

"WHEREAS the fishing industry has been, and will continue to be, the cornerstone of this Province's culture and economy;

AND WHEREAS the fishing industry in this Province is in crisis;

AND WHEREAS the crisis demands a new sense of direction and strengthening;

AND WHEREAS the submersion of the Department of Fisheries into the new Department of Fisheries, Food and Agriculture weakens rather than strengthens efforts to revive the fishing industry in this Province;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that this House of Assembly strongly urge the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador and its Premier to reinstate a Department of Fisheries concerned solely with fisheries and fishery related matters; strengthened and revitalized; and, separate from the Department of Fisheries, Food and Agriculture announced by the Premier on August 26, 1994."

The Honourable the Minister of Municipal and Provincial Affairs (Mr. Reid) gave notice that he would on tomorrow ask leave to introduce a Bill entitled, "An Act To Amend The City Of Corner Brook Act And The City of Mount Pearl Act" (Bill No. 40).

The Honourable the Minister of Environment (Mr. Aylward) gave notice that he would on tomorrow ask leave to introduce a Bill entitled, "An Act To Amend The Waste Material Disposal Act" (Bill No. 34).

Pursuant to Standing Order 23, the Member for Burin - Placentia West (Mr. Tobin) moved the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, that being the impending unemployment at the Marystown Shipyard caused by moving a portion of the Hibernia contract to New Brunswick.

The Speaker (Mr. Snow) recessed the House.

After a 15 minute recess, the Speaker resumed the Chair.

Before the Speaker ruled on the matter, the Government House Leader (Mr. Roberts) announced that an agreement had been reached with the Opposition. By leave, the House agreed that there would be an adjournment debate lasting two hours with 2 Members speaking from each side of the House, after which the House would vote on the motion to adjourn.

Pursuant to this agreement, debate commenced on the motion to adjourn.

The Government House Leader moved that the House not adjourn at 5 o'clock in the afternoon. The Speaker put the motion.

The motion was carried.

The Honourable the Premier tabled certain letters relating to the Hibernia Contract at the Marystown Shipyard.

The debate on the motion to adjourn concluded.


The Speaker put the question that the House do now adjourn.

Wednesday, March 15th, 1995

The House met at 2 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to the motion of adjournment adopted by the House on December 16th, 1994.

The Sergeant-at-Arms announced the arrival of His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor took the Chair.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to make the following Speech:

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

The Second Session of the 42nd General Assembly of this Honourable House of Assembly is about to be prorogued, but before releasing you from your duties, I wish to thank you for the careful and sympathetic attention given to the important matters brought before you by My Ministers.

Fifty-four pieces of legislation were enacted during this Session of the Honourable House of Assembly. In particular, legislative initiatives were taken in finance, employment and labour relations, development, energy, health, and the environment during 1994.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

As stated in My Address opening this Session, it has been the goal of My Ministers during this administration to attract business investment as a means of creating employment opportunities in the Province. To accomplish this goal, this House passed **An Act To Promote Economic Diversification and Growth Enterprises**. As well, the **Income Tax Act** was amended to reduce the general tax rate on corporations from 16% to 14% and on manufacturing and processing income from 7.5% to 5%. My Ministers also introduced legislation to privatize the Newfoundland and Labrador Computer Services Limited.

Ever mindful of the environmental concerns of our citizens, My Ministers introduced the **Grand Concourse Authority Act**, the purpose of which will be to foster, promote and enable the design, development and operation of an integrated network of walkways in the St. John's Region. As well, the **Waste Material Disposal Act** was amended to tighten the offence provisions of that Act.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

A new **Electrical Power Control Act** was enacted to revise and extend the existing law by providing for the planning, allocation and re-allocation of electrical power and power emergencies in the Province. **The Mining and Mineral Rights Tax Act** was substantially revised to clarify and streamline the existing law.

A **Literacy Development Council Act** was created to assess and respond to the literacy needs of our citizens.

A revised **Pharmaceutical Association Act** was also enacted.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY;

After listening to the views of our citizens, My Ministers introduced further amendments to the **Worker's Compensation Act**. Among the amendments enacted was the repeal of the appeal tribunal and its substitution by a review division consisting of review commissioners who will individually have the power to review decisions of the Worker's Compensation Commission. My Ministers feel that this new structure will offer our citizens a more equitable appeal mechanism under the Act.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY;

My Ministers remain firm in their conviction that there are bright spots in the fishery, in particular, aquaculture. In order to encourage this industry, this House passed significant amendments to the **Aquaculture Act**.

Many other significant legislature measures were also enacted during this Session.

MR. SPEAKER AND MEMBERS OF THE HONOURABLE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY:

I thank you for the large measure of supply you have granted. I assure you that the appropriations that you have granted have been and will be expended by My Ministers with care and efficiency.


