The House met at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to adjournment.

The Member for Humber Valley (Mr. Ball) made a Statement to recognize volunteers of the Town of Jackson's Arm.

The Member for Bonavista North (Mr. Harding) made a Statement to recognize the Cape Freels Heritage Trust.

The Member for Bellevue (Mr. Barrett) made a Statement to congratulate the Crescent Collegiate Drama Club in Blaketown which earned the first place award at the Western Avalon Regional Drama Festival.

The Member for Mount Pearl (Mr. Denine) made a Statement to congratulate Mr. Patrick Walsh who was chosen Citizen of the Year for 2006.

The Member for Carbonear-Harbour Grace (Mr. Sweeney) made a Statement to congratulate the Carbonear Collegiate Sentinels Male and Female Wrestling Teams which won the 2007 School Sport Newfoundland and Labrador High School Provincial Wrestling Championships.
