The House met at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to adjournment.

The Member for Bay of Islands (Mr. Loder) made a Statement to recognize twenty-two parishioners of Westside Pentecostal Tabernacle in Corner Brook who will be volunteering their time and talents to construct the William Cornelius Vocational Training Centre in Guatemala.

The Member for Cartwright-L'Anse au Clair (Ms. Jones) made a Statement to congratulate Garreth Kippenhuck, a Grade 8 pupil at William Gillett Academy in Charlottetown, who received the overall award in the 2008 Heritage Day Poster Contest.

The Member for St. John's East (Mr. Buckingham) made a Statement to pay tribute to the former Mayor of St. John's, Andy Wells.

The Member for Port de Grave (Mr. Butler) made a Statement to congratulate the pupils of Ascension Collegiate who were honoured at the 42<sup>nd</sup> Annual Awards night held at the school.

The Member for Bellevue (Mr. Peach) made a Statement to congratulate twins Mrs. Lilly Williams and Mrs. Laura Williams on the occasion of their 90<sup>th</sup> birthday.

The Member for Burgeo - LaPoile (Mr. Parsons) made a Statement to congratulate Mr. Brian Button who received an award from the Department of Municipal Affairs in recognition of twelve consecutive years of service to the Town of Channel-Port aux Basques.

The Honourable the Minister of Health and Community Services (Mr. Wiseman) made a Statement to recognize Waypoints (formerly the St. Francis Foundation) on 30 years of service in Newfoundland and Labrador.

The Honourable the Minister of Business (Mr. Oram) made a Statement respecting Newfoundland and Labrador's brand identity.

The Leader of the Opposition (Ms. Jones) presented a Petition on behalf of certain residents of the Province calling upon the House of Assembly to urge Government to establish a long-term drug and alcohol addictions treatment facility in the Province.

The Honourable the Speaker tabled the list of documents deemed tabled or submitted to the office of the Clerk for distribution between June 4, 2007 and March 10, 2008.

Pursuant to notice and on motion the following Bills were introduced and read a first time:

A Bill, "An Act Respecting The Cost Of Consumer Credit Disclosure" (Bill No. 4);

A Bill, "An Act Respecting Architects And The Provision Of Architectural Services" (Bill No. 5);

A Bill, "An Act Respecting Embalmers And Funeral Directors" (Bill No. 11);

A Bill, "An Act To Amend The Access To Information And Protection Of Privacy Act" (Bill No. 6);

A Bill, "An Act Respecting Registered Nurses" (Bill No. 3).

On motion it was ordered that the above-noted Bills be read a second time on tomorrow.

On motion of the Honourable the Government House Leader (Mr. Rideout), the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole on Supply to consider a Certain Resolution and a Bill for the Granting of Interim Supply to Her Majesty (Bill No. 2).

The Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Osborne took the Chair of Committee of the Whole on Supply.

The Committee of Supply considered a certain Resolution and Bill No. 2 for the Granting of Interim Supply to Her Majesty.
