## Thursday, May 21st, 2009

The House met at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to adjournment.

By leave, the Member for Lake Melville (Mr. Hickey) made a Statement to pay tribute to the late Mr. Henry Shouse.

The Member for Signal Hill – Quidi Vidi (Ms. Michael) made a Statement to congratulate the Quidi Vidi Village Foundation on their tenth anniversary.

The Member for Placentia – St. Mary's (Mr. Collins) made a Statement to recognize Genevieve Follett and Frances Pearson who are recipients of the Caring Canadian Award.

The Member for Cartwright – L'Anse au Clair (Ms. Jones) made a Statement to congratulate Taylor Rae Groves, Matthew Buckle, Michael Thomas and Christy Groves for their success in the Protected Areas Association's Wild Art competition.

The Member for Baie Verte – Springdale (Mr. Pollard) made a Statement to congratulate Kyle Hennebury who won the gold medal in the Industrial Millwright Mechanic-Post Secondary category at the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Provincial Skilled Trade and Technology competition.

The Honourable the Minister of Finance and President of Treasury Board (Mr. Kennedy), in accordance with section 26(5)(a) of the **Financial Administration Act**, tabled copies of the following Orders in Council relating to the following funding precommitments:

(a) Order in Council 2009-165 which authorized the Department of Human Resources, Labour and Employment to pre-commit \$7,000,000 against its 2010-11 budgetary appropriations for programs and services administered under the Employment Development Programs, Employment Assistance for Persons with Disabilities Program and Youth and Student Services Program to facilitate the delivery of its programs and services;

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- (b) Order in Council 2009-166 which authorized the Department of Natural Resources to pre-commit \$285,000 and \$150,000 against its 2010-11 and 2011-12 budgetary allocations respectively to facilitate entering into an agreement with Natural Resources Canada;
- (c) Order in Council 2009-167 which authorized the Office of the Chief Information Officer to pre-commit funds against its budgetary appropriations as follows: \$371,550 for 2010-11, \$410,125 for 2011-12, \$451,900 for 2012-13 and \$485,850 for 2013-14 to enter into a five-year agreement with software vendor ESRI Canada Limited for the provision of Geographic Information System Software.
