Tuesday, June 8th, 2010

On Tuesday, June 8th, 2010 at 10:00 o'clock in the morning the Honourable the Speaker (Mr. Fitzgerald) and the Clerk of the House of Assembly attended upon the Honourable John C. Crosbie, P.C., OC, ONL, QC Lieutenant Governor of Newfoundland and Labrador at Government House.

The Speaker addressed His Honour as follows:

"It is my agreeable duty on behalf of Her Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, Her Faithful Commons in Newfoundland and Labrador, to present to Your Honour a Bill for the appropriation of Supply granted in the present Session."

Whereupon the Clerk read the following Bill:

A Bill, "An Act For Granting To Her Majesty Certain Sums Of Money For Defraying Certain Expenses Of The Public Service For The Financial Year Ending March 31, 2011 And For Other Purposes Relating To The Public Service" (Bill No. 6).

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor then said, "In Her Majesty's Name, I thank Her Loyal Subjects, I accept their benevolence, and I assent to this Bill".

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The House met at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to adjournment.

The Member for Topsail (Mr. Davis) made a Statement to congratulate the members of the Worsley Park 50+ Club.

The Member for Mount Pearl North (Mr. Kent) made a Statement to congratulate the City of Mount Pearl and its youth on a successful Focus on Youth Awards ceremony.

The Member for Humber Valley (Mr. Kelly) made a Statement to congratulate the graduating class of Hampden Academy.

The Honourable the Minister of Tourism, Culture & Recreation (Mr. French) made a Statement about Tourism Awareness Week.

The Honourable the Minister of Finance and President of Treasury Board (Mr. Marshall) in accordance with section 26(4) of the **Financial Administration Act**, tabled copies of the following Orders in Council relating to the funding pre-commitments:

- (a) Order in Council 2010-162 which authorized the Department of Human Resources, Labour and Employment to pre-commit \$1,420,000 against its 2011-12 and \$1,160,000 against its 2012-13 budgetary appropriations in order to enter into a cost-shared agreement with Corner Brook Pulp and Paper Limited to support implementation of a comprehensive training program;
- (b) Order in Council 2010-163 which authorized the Department of Tourism, Culture and Recreation to pre-commit funding of \$1.5 against its budgetary appropriations for 2011-12 for an equity contribution to the "Republic of Doyle" television series.

Pursuant to notice and on motion the Bill entitled "An Act To Amend The Architects Act, 2008" (Bill No. 26) was introduced and read the first time and on motion it was ordered that Bill No. 26 be read the second time on tomorrow.

Pursuant to order and on motion debate continued and concluded on Second Reading of a Bill entitled "An Act Respecting The Care And Protection Of Children And Youth" (Bill No. 1) and on motion it was ordered that Bill No. 1 be now read the second time.

Pursuant to order and on motion the Bill entitled "An Act Respecting The Care And Protection Of Children And Youth" (Bill No. 1) was read the second time and on

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motion it was ordered that Bill No. 1 be referred to a Committee of the Whole House presently.

On motion of the Honourable the Government House Leader (Ms. Burke) the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole House.

The Speaker left the Chair. Mr. Kelly took the Chair of Committee of the Whole House.

The Committee of the Whole began their consideration of a Bill entitled "An Act Respecting The Care And Protection Of Children And Youth" (Bill No. 1).

The Opposition House Leader (Mr. Parsons) advised the Committee that the Official Opposition would move four amendments. The Chair reviewed the amendments and declared them to be in order.

The Chair rose the Committee at 5:30 o'clock in the afternoon and reported that the Committee of the Whole had commenced their consideration of the matters to them referred, had made some progress and asked leave to sit again.

On motion the report of the Committee was received and adopted.

It was moved and seconded that when the House rose it would adjourn until tomorrow, Wednesday, June 9th at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon.

On motion the House then adjourned accordingly.
