

Tuesday, March 29<sup>th</sup>, 2011

The House met at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to adjournment.

The Member for Conception Bay East – Bell Island (Mr. Brazil) made a Statement to congratulate Mrs. Victoria Carbage on her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.

The Member for Topsail (Mr. Davis) made a Statement to congratulate the Mount Pearl Seniors Independence Group for their success in providing services to their members.

The Member for Humber Valley (Mr. Kelly) made a Statement to recognize Sam and Pearl King who, on a volunteer basis, operate the Deer Lake Food Bank.

The Honourable the Minister of Child, Youth & Family Services (Ms. Johnson) made a Statement to inform the House that 107 Child, Youth & Family Services staff members and related services had moved from the Western Regional Health Authority to the Department of Child, Youth & Family Services.

The Honourable the Minister of Fisheries & Aquaculture (Mr. Jackman) made a Statement to inform the House about a series of important initiatives that have been undertaken by the Department of Fisheries & Aquaculture.

The Member for Burgeo – La Poile (Mr. Parsons) presented a Petition calling on the House of Assembly to urge Government to construct and operate a waiting room/restroom facility at the Town of Rose Blanche-Harbour Le Cou such that all users of the provincial ferry service may be able to utilize such waiting area/washroom facilities.
