The House met at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon pursuant to adjournment.

By leave the Member for Topsail (Mr. Davis) made a Statement to pay tribute to the late Riley Mercer and extend condolences to the Mercer family.

The Member for St. John's North (Mr. Kirby) made a Statement to congratulate the O'Brien Farm Foundation on their work.

The Member for Bonavista South (Mr. Little) made a Statement to pay tribute to the late Gerald Strickland who was awarded the Province's medal of Bravery Award posthumously.

The Member for Port de Grave (Mr. Littlejohn) made a Statement to congratulate Julia Clarke who has been accepted to attend the National Ballet School summer school programme and Brittany Vaters who has been accepted at the Quinte Ballet School.

The Speaker left the Chair.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor took the Chair.

The Speaker addressed His Honour as follows:

"It is my agreeable duty on behalf of Her Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, Her Faithful Commons in Newfoundland and Labrador, to present to your Honour a Bill for the Appropriation of Supply granted in the present Session."

The Honourable the Government House Leader (Mr. King) moved, "That when this House adjourns today, it stands adjourned to the call of the Chair."

The Speaker put the question on the motion and declared the motion carried.
