The House observed a minute of silence

The Honourable the Minister of Business, Tourism, Culture and Rural Development (Mr. Mitchelmore) made a Statement to announce that Newfoundland and Labrador will welcome the Princess Royal, the Royal Newfoundland Regiment's Colonel-in-Chief to the Province to participate in commemorative events for the 100th Anniversary of the battle of the Somme.

The Honourable the Minister of Environment and Conservation (Mr. Trimper) made a Statement to inform the House that a spring training programme has been launched for drinking water system operators.

The Member for St. John's East – Quidi Vidi (Ms. Michael) presented a Petition from certain residents of the Province calling upon the House of Assembly to urge Government to ensure that the Deficit Reduction Levy is eliminated and any replacement measure is based on progressive taxation principles and that an independent review of the provincial tax system begins immediately.

The Member for Mount Pearl North (Mr. Kent) presented a Petition from certain residents of the Province calling upon the House of Assembly to urge Government to set targets for improving the food security of Newfoundland and Labrador by promoting the growing in this Province of more of the food we consume.

The Member for Conception Bay South (Mr. Petten) presented a Petition from certain residents of the Province calling upon the House of Assembly to urge Government to press the Provinces' Federal Members of Parliament and the Federal Government to reduce Marine Atlantic ferry rates.

Pursuant to notice and on motion the Bill entitled "An Act Respecting Insured Medical And Hospital Services In The Province" (Bill No. 24) was introduced and read the first time and on motion it was ordered that the said Bill be read the second time on tomorrow.

Pursuant to order and on motion debate continued on the motion "That This House Approves in General the Budgetary Policy of the Government" (the Budget Speech).

During the debate the Member for Topsail – Paradise (Mr. Davis) moved, seconded by the Member for Mount Pearl North (Mr. Kent), the following amendment to the Budget motion (being a non-confidence motion):

"That all the words after "that" be deleted and the following substituted:

'this House deplores the Government's failure to deal adequately with the real problems facing our people and its failure to provide competent management to our Province.' "

The Speaker (Ms. Dempster) suspended the proceedings at 3:54 o'clock in the afternoon to consider the amendment.

The Speaker resumed the Chair at 4:06 o'clock in the afternoon and ruled the amendment in order.

Debate continued on the amendment to the Budget Speech (being a nonconfidence motion) and on motion debate was adjourned for further debate on tomorrow.

It was moved and seconded that when the House rose it would adjourn until tomorrow, Wednesday, April 20th at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon.

On motion the House then adjourned accordingly.
