Pursuant to order and on motion debate continued and concluded on Second Reading of a Bill entitled "An Act Respecting Children, Youth And Families" (Bill No. 14) and on motion it was ordered that Bill No.14 be now read the second time.

Pursuant to order and on motion the Bill entitled "An Act Respecting Children, Youth And Families" (Bill No. 14) was read the second time and on motion it was ordered that Bill No. 14 be referred to a Committee of the Whole House now.
