The House met at 10:00 o'clock in the morning pursuant to adjournment.

The Honourable the Speaker (Mr. Trimper) ruled on three points of order raised on November 21st, 2018, two by the Leader of the Third Party (Ms. Rogers) and one by the Honourable the Minister of Children, Seniors and Social Development (Ms. Dempster). In respect of all three cases the Speaker ruled that there was no point of order.

Pursuant to order and on motion the following Bills were read the third time and passed:

A Bill, "An Act To Amend The Workplace Health, Safety And Compensation Act" (Bill No. 35);

A Bill, "An Act Respecting A Pension Plan For Teachers" (Bill No. 45).

On motion it was ordered that the said Bills be printed being entitled as above and that they be submitted to Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor for her assent.

Pursuant to order and on motion debate commenced and concluded on Second Reading of a Bill entitled "An Act Respecting The Provision Of Emergency Health And Paramedicine Services" (Bill No. 43) and on motion it was ordered that Bill No. 43 be now read the second time.

Pursuant to order and on motion the Bill entitled "An Act Respecting The Provision Of Emergency Health And Paramedicine Services" (Bill No. 43) was read the second time and on motion it was ordered that Bill No. 43 be referred to a Committee of the Whole now.

On motion of the Honourable the Government House Leader (Mr. Parsons) the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole House to consider a Bill entitled "An Act Respecting The Provision Of Emergency Health And Paramedicine Services" (Bill No. 43).

The Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Warr took the Chair of Committee of the Whole House.

On motion the Committee rose.

The Speaker resumed the Chair.

The Chairperson of the Committee of the Whole (Mr. Warr) reported that the Committee of the Whole House had considered the matters to them referred and had

On motion it was ordered that the said Bill be printed being entitled as above and that it be submitted to Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor for her assent.

Pursuant to Standing Order 9(1)(b) the sitting was suspended at 12:15 p.m. The Speaker resumed the Chair at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon.

The Speaker suspended the proceedings at 3:30 o'clock in the afternoon to await the arrival of Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor.

At 3:45 o'clock in the afternoon, the Sergeant-at-Arms announced the arrival of Her Honour, the Lieutenant Governor.

The Speaker left the Chair.

Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor took the Chair.

The Speaker addressed Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor as follows:

"May it please your Honour, the General Assembly of the Province has at its present session passed certain Bills, to which, in the name and on behalf of the General Assembly, I respectfully request Your Honour's assent."
