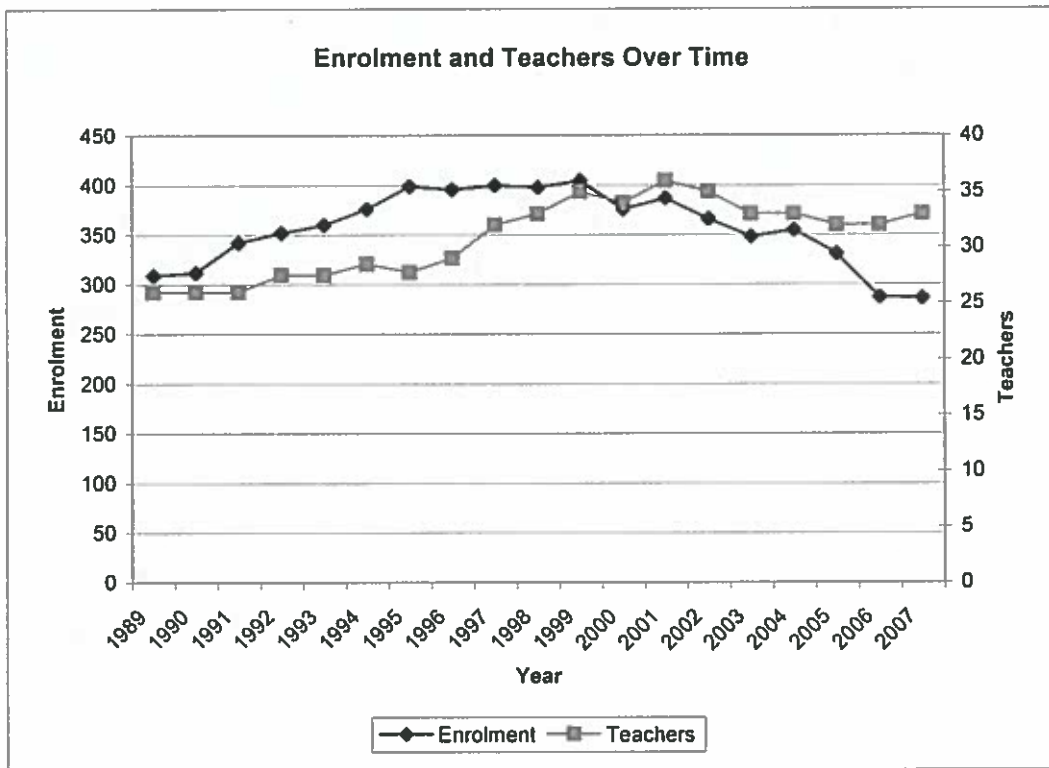

Dear Sir:

I write further to your telephone call to Deputy Chief Robert Johnston of this date. You inquired of Deputy Chief Johnston as to whether or not the RNC would have any concerns if two letters were tabled in the House of Assembly. (The two letters were dated November 22, 2007 and November 30, 2007. In the former, you brought to our attention a complaint relating to the Eastern School Board's Newfoundland International Exchange Program and Homestay Program. You brought this to our attention on behalf of the Minister of Education. In the November 30, 2007 reply letter Deputy Chief Johnston advised that the matter was under investigation

On Deputy Chief Johnston's behalf, I advise that the RNC does have concerns that the public release of these letters could impact a criminal investigation negatively. We ask that these letters not be released publicly.
