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## **OVERVIEW**

On February 27, 2006, the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador announced the formation of the Minister's Advisory Committee on Labrador Transportation. This committee consists of key stakeholders representing the needs of people and businesses across Labrador. The committee provides a two-way forum to share views on policy, programs and services, as well as, represents a common understanding of the transportation needs of people and businesses throughout Labrador.

Chaired by the Minister of Transportation and Works, the Advisory Committee consists of up to ten members and must ensure representation from across Labrador. Committee members are appointed for a two-year term, renewable at the Minister's discretion, and usually meet twice per year or when deemed necessary by the Minister.

## **MANDATE**

The Minister's Advisory Committee on Labrador Transportation is a volunteer committee of key stakeholders whose mandate is:

- 1. To provide a two-way forum to share views and provide advice on policy, programs and services, both existing and proposed, for transportation matters in Labrador.
- 2. To develop a common understanding of the transportation needs of people and businesses throughout Labrador.

## **VALUES**

The Minister's Advisory Committee is instrumental in advising the Provincial Government as it moves forward to address the challenges and demands related to transportation in Labrador. This Committee is chaired by the Minister of Transportation and Works, and as such, has adopted the values of the Department, where applicable.

The values of the Department of Transportation and Works are as follows:

## Accountability

Each person accepts responsibility for their own actions as well as those of the team and follows through on requests and commitments.

#### Communication

Each person takes initiative to share information with co-workers in support of the Department's mandate in a timely manner, ensures that appropriate information is recorded using the Department's information management tools and supports the sharing of timely and relevant information with public audiences.

Each person completes all tasks efficiently and effectively, willingly supports others to fulfil their role, honours their hours of work and avails of learning opportunities.

#### Respect

Each person promotes a respectful work environment that values mutual respect, fairness and equality.

#### Safety

Each person has the right to safety and shares responsibility for maintaining a safe, healthy and risk free environment for themselves, other employees and the general public.

#### **Teamwork**

Each person interacts with their peers to share information freely with co-workers and works with others to fulfil the responsibilities of the organization.

## **PRIMARY CLIENT**

The primary client of the Minister's Advisory Committee on Labrador Transportation is the Minister of Transportation and Works.

## **VISION AND MISSION**

Given the mandate of the Minister's Advisory Committee on Labrador Transportation, the Committee has reviewed the Vision and Mission of the Department of Transportation and Works and adopted them where they relate to transportation in Labrador.

## **VISION**

The vision of the Department of Transportation and Works is of a safe, reliable and sustainable transportation and public works infrastructure that supports the social and economic needs of the Province.

## **MISSION**

The Department of Transportation and Works will have provided, managed and maintained a safe, reliable and environmentally sound transportation and public works infrastructure by 2017.

The mission statement identifies the priority focus of the Minister of the Department of Transportation and Works and covers two planning cycles. By conveying the transportation needs of Labradorians, the Committee assists Government in improving and aligning transportation services to meet the future economic and social needs of the Province. ## **ACTIVITIES**

The Minister's Advisory Committee exists exclusively as an advisory body to Government and therefore has not developed goals but rather a single objective that will be reported on annually throughout the duration of its 2011-14 Activity Plan.

The Committee serves as a two-way forum to share views and provide advice on policies, programs and services. Through open and candid discussions, the Committee represents a common understanding of transportation needs and serves as a tool for greater informed decision-making regarding transportation in Labrador.

By March 31, 2014, the Minister's Advisory Committee on Labrador Transportation will have provided advice to the Minister pertaining to transportation in Labrador.
