## **Departmental Overview**

On February 22, 2017, the former Labrador and Aboriginal Affairs Office was restructured to form the new Office of Labrador Affairs (OLA) with the Aboriginal Affairs branch merged with Intergovernmental Affairs to create the Intergovernmental and Indigenous Affairs Secretariat.

The Office focuses on advocating for the social and economic development of Labrador while providing advice on government policies, planning and programs that impact Labrador.

The Office strives to develop a focused approach to Government's service delivery in Labrador, and demonstrates Government's commitment to support Labrador issues through the administration of Labrador specific programs for which the OLA is responsible. Examples of such programs are:

- the Labrador Transportation Grooming Subsidy;
- the Labrador Aboriginal Nutritional and Artistic Assistance Program; and
- annual funding support for the Combined Councils of Labrador.

The OLA collaborates with Provincial Government departments/entities, federal and municipal governments, industry organizations and social enterprises to advance the economic and social development of Labrador. The Office also takes prominent roles on Labrador focused committees such as the Labrador West Regional Task Force, which is a committee consisting of provincial, federal and municipal stakeholders and representatives from various mining companies operating in Labrador West to discuss impacts on the region.

The Office liaises with other northern ministries and assists in the management of intergovernmental relations on Labrador/northern issues, such as the Northern Development Ministers Forum.

The OLA has offices in Happy Valley-Goose Bay and Wabush. There are ten employees; nine employees (four male, five female) in the Happy Valley-Goose Bay office and one employee (female) in Wabush. A seasonal position is employed from December to May annually, and is located in North West River. The Deputy Minister for the Office of Labrador Affairs is located in St. John's.

The Communications Manager also supports the Intergovernmental and Indigenous Affairs Secretariat.

# Issue One: Socio-Economic Development of Labrador

The mandate for the Office of Labrador Affairs is to ensure provincial policies, programs and planning must appropriately adapt to the unique issues and opportunities that exist in Labrador.

Major resource developments in Labrador contribute to the economic progress of Labrador, and the province as a whole. As these developments are pursued, the OLA works across departments/entities to ensure they reflect the social, cultural, geographic and economic needs of the region.

Advocacy, open communication and support are required to ensure that matters of importance to Labrador are addressed, with the OLA taking leadership in these areas.

Through Government's strategic planning, the OLA will help ensure the Province is prepared for existing and future demands.

#### GOAL:

By March 31, 2020, the Office of Labrador Affairs will have supported the socioeconomic development of Labrador through implementation, collaboration, communication and input from a Labrador perspective.

#### **Indicators:**

- Administered Labrador-specific programs to address the needs of Labradorians and ensure effective program delivery;
- Provided advice on all relevant government policies, programs and planning impacting Labrador;
- Implemented tools to support the social and economic development in Labrador; and,
- Participated on boards/committees and in consultations/meetings to provide input from a Labrador perspective.

### **Objective 1:**

By March 31, 2018, the Office of Labrador Affairs will have supported the socioeconomic development of Labrador through implementation, collaboration, communication and input from a Labrador perspective.

#### **Indicators:**

- Finalized the evaluation of the Labrador Transportation Grooming Subsidy;
- Renewed contracts for the Labrador Aboriginal Nutritional and Artistic Assistance Program;
- Considered tools to support the social and economic development in Labrador; and,
- Participated on boards/committees and in consultations/meetings to provide input from a Labrador perspective.

## **Objective 2:**

By March 31, 2019, the Office of Labrador Affairs will continue to support the socio-economic development of Labrador through implementation, collaboration, communication and providing information from a Labrador perspective.

## **Objective 3:**

By March 31, 2020, the Office of Labrador Affairs will continue to support the socio-economic development of Labrador through implementation, collaboration, communication and providing information from a Labrador perspective.

# **Issue Two: Labrador Relationships**

Through open communication and consultations with stakeholders, residents, and community advocates, the Office can better understand and represent the concerns of Labradorians.

In addition to the open dialogue and communication with Labrador's residents, the Office of Labrador Affairs communicates and collaborates with other provincial departments and agencies to ensure that information and advice is reviewed with a Labrador perspective.

Through information gathering and knowledge, the Office's mission to advocate for the appropriate consideration and integration of Labrador's needs into provincial policies, planning and programs may be achieved.

#### GOAL:

By March 31, 2020, the Office of Labrador Affairs will have increased collaboration with Labrador stakeholders through communication, consultation and input from a Labrador perspective.

#### **Indicators:**

- Provided input on Labrador perspectives in the development of government policy, planning and programs;
- Communicated and monitored provincial government initiatives related to Labrador; and,
- Participated on boards and committees and in consultations and meetings to provide input on a Labrador perspective.

### **Objective 1:**

By March 31, 2018, the Office of Labrador Affairs will have increased collaboration with Labrador stakeholders through communication, consultation and input from a Labrador perspective.

#### **Indicators:**

- Developed a stakeholder engagement plan;
- Conducted meetings with service providers of the Labrador Transportation
  Grooming Subsidy program;
- Assisted with the coordination of meetings between the Combined Councils of Labrador and provincial government departments; and,
- Participated in Labrador-related conferences and events such as Expo Labrador, Mine X and Cain's Quest.

By March 31, 2019, the Office of Labrador Affairs will continue to support Labrador relations through communication, consultation and input from a Labrador perspective.

## **Annex A: Strategic Directions**

Strategic Directions are the articulation of desired physical, social and economic outcomes and normally require action by more than one government entity.
